Children and Parents Program (CAP) | 301-324-2872

This program offers comprehensive addiction, mental health, rehabilitative and case management services to adult women, including pregnant women and women with children. Services include:

- ✚ Intensive outpatient counseling, active outreach, on-site supervision of client's preschool-aged children, assistance with transportation to/from program, psychosocial rehabilitation and referral to health care services and residential treatment

Dental Health Services | 301-583-5900

General dental services are available to maternity patients who are referred from the Health Department's Maternal Health and Family Planning Program, and to children ages birth to 18 years, and other uninsured adults. Services include:

- ✚ Comprehensive dental treatment with an emphasis on prevention and early intervention
- ✚ Referrals for specialty care
- ✚ Case management services to assist Maryland Healthy Smiles Dental Program enrollees in finding a dentist and making dental appointments

Healthy Start Program | 301-883-7230

Case management services are provided to pregnant women at risk of poor birth outcomes related to psychosocial and behavioral risk factors, and at-risk children up to age 2 years. Telephone and home visiting services include:

- ✚ Counseling, parenting information and referrals to other health services

Medical Assistance (MA) for Families and the Maryland Children's Health Program (MCHP) | 1-888-561-4049

Medical Assistance for Families (Medicaid) provides free health insurance for families with very low incomes. The Maryland Children's Health Program (MCHP) provides free health insurance to pregnant women, and children up to the age of 19 in low-to-average income families.

The MCHP Premium Program provides low-cost insurance to children in families whose incomes are too high to qualify for the free program and who earn less than 300% of the federal poverty level.

Covered services include:

- ✚ In-patient hospital care
- ✚ medical doctor visits
- ✚ lab tests
- ✚ dental care
- ✚ eye care
- ✚ medicines
- ✚ immunizations

Maternal Health and Family Planning Program | 1-888-561-4049

This program provides comprehensive risk-appropriate prenatal care and reproductive health services to uninsured and underinsured women. Services include:

- ✚ Pregnancy testing, pre- and postnatal care, hospital delivery arrangements, referral to English/Spanish childbirth classes, family planning and emergency contraception, nutrition counseling, cervical cancer screening, HIV counseling and testing, abnormal Pap test follow-up
- ✚ Counseling to women during pregnancy
- ✚ Referral services to the Maryland Children's Health Program (MCHP), WIC and the Healthy Start Programs

Tapestry Program | 301-583-3340

The Tapestry Program offers specialty care and perinatology services to high-risk prenatal women. Maternity services are provided by a maternal fetal medicine specialist and a trained certified nurse-midwife.

<p style="text-align: center;">For At-Risk New Mothers and Their Infants</p>	<p>Care For Kids Program 301-883-7858 Care for Kids Program is a partnership between the Health Department and Kaiser Permanente to provide medical services to uninsured children under 19 years of age who are residents of Prince George's County and who do not qualify for any government health insurance program and cannot afford private insurance. More information on the program and an application for services is available.</p>
	<p>Infant at Risk Program 301-618-2464 This is a hospital-based intervention service, achieved through a bedside visit with mothers and infants up to age 1 at Prince George's Hospital Center or by telephone intake. Special focus is placed on inter-agency coordination of services to high-risk mothers and infants, especially maternal substance abusers, HIV-positive women and infants, premature infants, pregnant and parenting teens. Services include: Nursing visits in the hospital and home to provide a comprehensive needs assessment, short-term intervention, teaching and referrals to appropriate community resources</p>
	<p>Women, Infants and Children (WIC) Program 301-856-9600 WIC provides nutrition education, breast feeding education and support, and supplemental foods to low-income pregnant, breast feeding and postpartum women and children ages birth to 5 who are at nutritional risk.</p>
<p style="text-align: center;">For Female Teens</p>	<p>Healthy Teens Center 301-324-5141 Services are offered to young women ages 10 to 24 at the Healthy Teens Center to prevent pregnancy and sexually transmitted diseases, including: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ✚ Comprehensive reproductive health services; Education and counseling services that promote cooperative relationships, good nutrition and healthy behaviors </p>
	<p>Youth and Community Services Program (YCSP) 301-883-3514 The YCSP provides outpatient substance abuse treatment services to adolescent female County residents between ages 11 and 18. Parental involvement in the program is strongly recommended. Services include: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ✚ Substance abuse assessments and referrals; crisis counseling; individual, family and group counseling; urinalysis and breathalyzer testing </p>
<p style="text-align: center;">For Women and Their Families</p>	<p>Adult Evaluation and Review Services (AERS) 301-324-2980 <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ✚ In-home evaluations of elderly and chronically ill persons to assist with resources that will enable clients to stay in their home or the least restrictive environment. </p>
	<p>Breast and Cervical Cancer Program (BCCP) 301-883-3525 <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ✚ Breast and cervical cancer screening (including mammograms and Pap tests) and diagnosis for breast or cervical cancer for women 40 and over who meet certain financial criteria; monthly breast cancer support group. </p>
	<p>Cancer Prevention, Education, Screening and Treatment Program (CPEST) 301-883-3524 <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ✚ Colorectal cancer screening for county residents over 50 who meet certain financial criteria. </p>
	<p>Epidemiology STD 301-583-3150 HIV 301-583-7752 TB 301-583-3110 CDC 301-583-3750 <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ✚ HIV counseling and testing, and sexually transmitted disease (STD) exams and treatment for any age (parental consent not required); HIV care for adults only (adolescents referred to Children's Hospital); Tuberculosis and other Communicable Disease Control services for any age (parental consent required) </p>
	<p>Healthline 1-888-561-4049 Healthline is a toll-free telephone information and referral service for those seeking information on programs that serve the needs of women, children and families, such as the Maryland Children's Health Program, Maryland Medicaid and HealthChoice state-sponsored insurance. Services include: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ✚ Assistance in locating medical and social services with community prenatal, preventive and other specialty health care service providers; ✚ Referrals to low-cost health care clinics; Follow-up phone calls to HealthChoice enrollees to educate them about the system/assure they receive all services to which they are entitled </p>
	<p>Healthy Women/Healthy Lives 301-583-3313 This program is for women of childbearing age to ensure their health and well being during the reproductive period of life and optimum health prior to pregnancy. It benefits all women, especially those with chronic health conditions such as hypertension, diabetes or anemia which contribute to a high-risk pregnancy. The goal is to minimize complications for mother and infant and to reduce infant mortality. Services include: Family planning examination; cholesterol, diabetes and high blood pressure screenings; nutritional counseling; folic acid supplements; referral to other health services.</p>
