

Update

Cold temperatures and frozen ground temperatures have prevented contractors from pouring concrete curb & gutter as well as putting pavement down on the site.

Representatives from SACO and Nardi did meet in the field to discuss the possibility of creating a stoned area for Nardi to use as a base to begin work on the Library until proper temperatures for paving come available. It was determined however, that given the large amount of stone that would be needed and given the poor weather conditions that would impede any meaningful construction progress during these winter months, it was not practical or beneficial to attempt to create this stoned area for Nardi.

Nevertheless, SACO has proceeded with the site utility installation and will continue to do so in order to be prepared to complete the concrete and paving work as soon as the ground thaws and temperatures reach 40+ degrees.

Greenbelt Middle School Update

One of the oldest facilities in the county, Greenbelt Middle School figures prominently in the history of the City of Greenbelt. Originally the project was approved as a renovation, modernization, and addition project, however this project now reflects an entire new building that is separate and free standing from the existing building.

The new school entrance is located on 6301 Breezewood Drive, Greenbelt, MD 20770. It will be a two story building with a centrally located media center, community accessibility, science classrooms, art, technology education, Family and Consumer Science, ESOL, Special Educations classrooms, gymnasium and cafeteria. Athletics amenities will include playing fields (soccer, softball and baseball). The design capacity for this school is 990 students, the grade levels will be 6th to 8th grade. This school is registered with the USGBC with the plan to seek LEED Gold Certification. The new 143,277 square foot building with on 32.872 acres has a budget of \$54,434,440.

Current project completion is around 5 percent due to inclement weather conditions. The expected completion of the school is June 2012 with a occupancy target date of August 2012. Upon completion of the new facility the historic portions of the existing building will be renovated, modernized, and persevered for a yet to be determined use.
