Turner partners with Fieldstone Properties and attends a Political Summit designed to establish a plan of action

Prince George's County Council Chair Ingrid M. Turner (D) - District 4, attended the Fieldstone Properties Franklin Park at Greenbelt Station Political Summit in support of their renovation efforts on Monday, April 4, 2011 from 10:00 am – 12:00 pm at 9220 Springhill Lane, Greenbelt, MD 20770.

Council Chair Turner and Mayor of Greenbelt Judith “J” Davis are political partners in this effort. They presented their perspective and expressed their support of this project. They also heard several presentations from Fieldstone Properties, LLC and were given a tour of the project.

Council Chair Turner is excited to be a political partner with Fieldstone and is encouraged by the organization's long-term vision and strategy for this property. “I am excited to partner with Fieldstone on the revitalization of this project and I understand their success is contingent upon public-private partnerships.”

Fieldstone Properties took over Franklin Park at Greenbelt Station in mid-October and is spending \$10 million on the first phase of remodeling the apartments. The Franklin Park at Greenbelt station is described as the largest garden apartment complex on the East Coast with 2,889 apartments and they are targeting members of the active military, veterans and displaced veterans. The new program has already attracted attention from nearby military facilities. The complex was previously known as the Empirian Village Apartment Complex.
