In the matter of **t/a Tick Tock Restaurant and Liquors**, the board reviewed a petition to appoint a trustee for the purposes of re-opening and selling t/a Tick Tock Restaurant and Liquors. Mr. Caldwell moved to deny the request, seconded by Mr. Howard and carried by Mr. Jackson. Mr. Mwalimu votes no to the motion.

In the matter of **t/a Golden Bull**, request for reconsideration and findings of fact and conclusions of law these agenda items were heard in the Regular Session of December 16, 2014.

In the matter of **t/a The Hotel at the University of Maryland**, the Commissioners were not given a presentation by Linda Carter, Counsel due to a family emergency on her part.

In the matter of adoption of the minutes of the Board of License Commissioners, Mr. Caldwell moved that the following minutes be officially adopted:

Seconded by Mr. Howard and made unanimous by Mr. Mwalimu and Mr. Jackson.

In the matter of **t/a Old Town Grille**, the Commissioners reviewed a request for a refillable container permit application (Growlers). Mr. Caldwell moved approval of a Growler Permit, seconded by Mr. Howard and made unanimous by Mr. Mwalimu and Mr. Jackson.

In the matter of legislation **PG 304-15 (Penalties)** – Mr. Mwalimu moved to oppose this legislation, seconded by Mr. Howard and made unanimous by Mr. Caldwell and Mr. Jackson.

In the matter of legislation **PG 307-15 (Salaries)**, Mr. Caldwell moved to amend the legislation to reflect the attorney for the Board's salary to be increased from \$15,000 to \$18,000 per annum, seconded by Mr. Howard and made unanimous by Mr. Mwalimu and Mr. Jackson.

In the matter of **t/a FedEx Field**, the Commissioners reviewed correspondence dated December 9, 2014 regarding change in officers (licensee remain unchanged). So noted by the Commissioners.

In the matter of **t/a Cedar Hill Inn**, the Chief Liquor Inspector presented an alleged violation of selling off sale while the restaurant was closed and no bartender, wait staff or cooks; that the alleged violation occurred on December 1, 2014. Mr. Caldwell moved to show cause, seconded by Mr. Howard and made unanimous by Mr. Mwalimu and Mr. Jackson.

In the matter of **t/a Mike's Restaurant and Liquors**, the Chief Liquor Inspector presented an alleged violation of selling off sale while the restaurant was closed. Mr. Caldwell moved to show cause, seconded by Mr. Howard and made unanimous by Mr. Mwalimu and Mr. Jackson.

In the matter of **t/a Mile High Restaurant**, the Chief Liquor Inspector presented an alleged violation of no utensils, certified food handler on duty, plates/silverware, wait staff on duty or food available. Mr. Howard moved to show cause, seconded by Mr. Caldwell and made unanimous by Mr. Mwalimu and Mr. Jackson.

In the matter of **t/a Fairwood Café**, the Chief Liquor Inspector presented an alleged violation of no kitchen. Mr. Caldwell moved to show cause, seconded by Mr. Howard and made unanimous by Mr. Mwalimu and Mr. Jackson.

In the matter of **t/a Crab Café**, the Chief Liquor Inspector presented an alleged violation of the business operating as a carryout with no wait staff on duty or pre-printed menus. Mr. Howard moved to show cause, seconded by Mr. Mwalimu and made unanimous by Mr. Caldwell and Mr. Jackson.

In the matter of **t/a Three Roads**, the Chief Liquor Inspector presented an alleged violation of no tables and chairs and a very limited menu. Mr. Howard moved to

show cause, seconded by Mr. Mwalimu and made unanimous by Mr. Caldwell and Mr. Jackson.

In the matter of **t/a Country Club at Woodmore**, the Chief Liquor Inspector presented an alleged violation of the country club operating outside of the scope of the alcoholic beverage license and further, a cover charge was being assessed. Mr. Howard moved to show cause, seconded by Mr. Caldwell and made unanimous by Mr. Mwalimu and Mr. Jackson.

In the matter of **t/a CD Liquors**, the Chief Liquor Inspector presented an alleged violation of individual cups with ice inside being retailed to the public. Mr. Howard moved to show cause, seconded by Mr. Mwalimu and made unanimous by Mr. Caldwell and Mr. Jackson.

In the matter of **t/a 201 Drive-Thru Liquors and t/a Cheverly Sports Fair**, the Chief Liquor Inspector presented alleged violations for sales to a minor. Mr. Howard moved to show cause, seconded by Mr. Mwalimu and made unanimous by Mr. Caldwell and Mr. Jackson.

In the matter of **t/a Hangar Club**, the Chief Liquor Inspector presented an alleged violation of having entertainment without the issuance of a Special Entertainment Permit. Mr. Caldwell moved to show cause, seconded by Mr. Howard and made unanimous by Mr. Mwalimu and Mr. Jackson.

In the matter of **t/a Jasper's**, the Chief Liquor Inspector presented an alleged violation of carding taking place at the entrance of the establishment and no issuance of a Special Entertainment Permit. Mr. Caldwell moved to not show cause as this is not a violation, seconded by Mr. Howard and made unanimous by Mr. Mwalimu and Mr. Jackson.
