Hector Velez began his 32 year law enforcement career as a Military Police Officer in the United States Army. During his six-year enlistment, he served in Frankfurt, Germany and Fort Meade, Maryland. In 1989, he accepted a position with the Howard County Police Department, Howard County, Maryland, and in 1994, accepted a lateral position with the Prince George's County Police Department, Prince George's County, Maryland.
