

**PUBLIC NOTICE

SUBSTANTIAL AMENDMENT TO THE FY 2009 ANNUAL ACTION PLAN**

The Prince George's County Proposed Homelessness Prevention and Rapid Re-Housing Program (HPRP), a substantial amendment to the Fiscal Year 2009 Annual Action Plan is now available for public comment for a period of 12 days. The public comment period will end on May 11, 2009. Free copies of the HPRP are made available to citizens and groups of interest upon request. The Homelessness Prevention and Rapid Re-Housing Program (HPRP) grant provides financial assistance and services to either prevent individuals and families from becoming homeless or help those who are experiencing homelessness to be quickly re-housed and stabilized.

The U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) has advised the County that \$2,512,242 has been allocated of HPRP funding. In order to receive its allocation of HPRP funding, the County must submit a HPRP substantial amendment to the "Annual Action Plan: FY 2009" by May 18, 2009.

The HPRP Substantial Amendment allows the Department of Housing and Community Development to use HPRP funds for eligible costs associated with financial assistance, housing relocation and stabilization services, data collection and evaluation and administration in the amount of \$2,512,242.

Proposed HPRP – funded activities:

▪ Total:	\$2,512,242
