

SAVE THE BAY

In your yard, at home and around your community, there are many things you can do to help reduce the amount of pollution and debris reaching the Chesapeake Bay:

- ▶ Make your lawn Bay-friendly and use native grasses or other plants that don't require watering or fertilizing. Visit the University of Maryland Extension for more Bay-friendly lawn tips and information at extension.umd.edu/baywise.
- ▶ Discard hazardous materials at the County's Household Hazardous Waste Acceptance Site at 11611 White House Road in Upper Marlboro. It's open Thursday, Friday and Saturday from 8 AM – 3:30 PM.
