



AGER ROAD

- Consistent, 28 foot width travelway in each direction with two 11-foot travel lanes and 6-foot bike lane
- 11-foot turn lanes at intersections
- Continuous 6-foot wide sidewalks
- Parallel parking in segments
- Several service roads removed









HAMILTON STREET (below)

- Resurfaced as a single 12-foot lane in each direction with left turn lanes (west of Ager Road)
- Continuous 6-foot bicycle lanes and sidewalks
- Intersection at Ager Road changed to provide single westbound lane





JAMESTOWN ROAD (above)


- Resurfaced as a single 11-foot lane in each direction with 6-foot wide bicycle lanes.
- 8-foot wide sidewalk on west (southbound) side
- Partial 6-foot wide sidewalk on east side





COMPLETE STREET ELEMENTS

- ADA-compliant sidewalks, driveway entrances and bus stops
- Shorter pedestrian crossing distances
- Sidewalk buffers
- Bus shelters at high-ridership stops
- Green painted bicycle lanes
- Countdown and accessible pedestrian signals/pushbuttons
- Actuated pedestrian flashers
- Rectangular Rapid Flashing Beacons (RRFB) at Nicholson Street and West Hyattsville Metro Station
- Connections to Northwest Branch Trail








GREEN STREET ELEMENTS

- Bio-swales
- Submerged gravel wetlands
- Bioretention
- Impervious area removed and replaced with sod
- LED lighting and traffic signals
- Promoting alternative transportation modes
- Landscaping
- Replacing Bradford
 Pear trees










NORTHWEST BRANCH

- ADA-compliant shared use path connection to Northwest Branch Trail
- Submerged gravel wetlands
- Bridge endwall and railing repairs
- Wider sidewalks on structure
- New concrete riding surface on structure








HEURICH PARK

- Enlarge existing micro-bioretention area at parking lot
- New submerged gravel wetland
- ADA-compliant driveway entrance
- Bioswale between roadway and dog park
