RECYCLING CONTAMINATION

- Contamination is COSTLY in down time and money.
- Processing stops, laborers are idle; equipment repairs are expensive.
- Causes a back log of recyclables on the tipping floor.
- Reduces productivity and revenue.
- Contaminants in the bales diminishes the value of recyclable materials and causes materials to be rejected by end markets.

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PRINCE GEORGE'S IS FOAM FREE!


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Starting July 1, 2016, polystyrene (commonly referred to as Styrofoam[™]), polystyrene loose fill packaging (also known as "packing peanuts") and other foam articles are not permitted for sale or use in Prince George's County.

WHY THE BAN?

To reduce the amount of polystyrene waste entering the landfill and littering our roadways, neighborhoods and local waterways, the County is requiring the use of non-foam food packaging products that are environmentally-friendly.

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WHAT CAN BE USED OR SOLD?

PLASTIC BAGS NOT ACCEPTED

Plastic bags are **not** accepted in the curbside collection of recyclable or organics (food scraps and yard trim).

Here's what NOT to recycle]

Any grocery, retail or trash plastic bag

Bread bags

Dry cleaning bags

Fruit and vegetable bags (fresh/frozen)

Garden product bags (soil/mulch)

Newspaper bags

Outer wrap from paper towel, napkin and diaper packages

Outer wrap from cases of soda, juice and snacks

Zipper or stand-up pouches, bubble or cling wrap

Crinkle bags for cereal, pasta or snack bags

Outer wrap from meat or cheese products

ELECTRONICS AND HOUSEHOLD ITEMS

Electronic waste contains many valuable, recoverable materials such as aluminum, copper, gold, silver, plastics, and ferrous metals. In order to conserve natural resources and energy, old or broken electronic equipment can be refurbished, reused or recycled instead od being thrown away and landfilled.

- Many items can be brought to the Electronics Recycling Acceptance Site, located at the landfill. For more information, visit <u>bit.ly/pgcelectronicwaste</u>.
- Check with local retailers to see some of the electronics they accept, such as Best Buy, Staples, Ikea, Home Depot, MOMs Organic Market and others!

Materials from large and bulky household items, like appliances, furniture, mattresses, or carpets, **should never be left on your property.** Bring these items to the landfill or schedule a bulky curbside collection appointment.



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Stash Your Trash!

This chart will help you find the appropriate place to properly dispose of litter and debris to bring your property into compliance.



| VIOLATION | SOLUTION |

| Dumping tires | Call 311 to schedule a bulky trash pickup. They will take up to four tires per trip. You can always schedule additional pickups to dispose of more tires. |
| Storing construction materials | Dispose of construction materials at the Richland Reclamation Landfill, 2001 Ritchie Road, Upper Marlboro. Vehicles are charged by size. Call 301–350–4059 for details. Mon–Fri, 7:00 AM–4:00 PM |
| Storing old furniture, broken appliances and fixtures, junk and debris | Call 311 to schedule a bulky trash pickup. Mon–Fri, 7:00 AM–7:00 PM |
| Keeping large loads of trash that does not qualify for weekly pickup | Transport items to the Brown Station Road Sanitary Landfill, 11611 White House Road, Upper Marlboro. Call 301–952–7625 for details. Mon–Sat, 8:00 AM–3:30 PM |
| Harboring hazardous materials and old electronics on your property | Take the materials to the Household Hazardous Waste Acceptance Site and Electronics Recycling Acceptance Site,11611 White House Road, Upper Marlboro. Thur–Sat, 8:00 AM–3:30 PM |





NOVEMBER curbside bulky trash appointments are now being scheduled.

Items that are too big to fit in your trash bin won't be hauled away in your regular curbside trash collection.

LIST OF ACCEPTABLE AND NON-ACCEPTABLE ITEMS FOR BULKY TRASH COLLECTION

Acceptable Materials

- Carpet and padding (*Limit of carpet and padding is 324 sq. ft. rolled and tied on ends*)
- Doors and cabinets (limit of 3 each)
- Furniture and refrigerators (*Limit of 5 appliances per pickup; doors must be taped shut*)
- Hot water heaters and lawn mowers (*Remove the gas tank and drain the oil from lawn mowers*)
- Other large materials/furniture items generated in the household that are not picked up by refuse collection
- Smaller household items:
 - Must be placed in bags or boxes Limit any combination of bags and boxes to 10 Weight limit of 60 pounds per bag or box Vehicle Tires (Limit of 4; vehicle tires only, no truck tires)
- Washing machines and dryers

Effective February 1, 2019, for the health and safety of staff, Prince George's County residents requesting curbside collection of Bulky items will be required to completely cover mattresses and box springs in a protective plastic covering. Mattresses and box springs delivered to the landfill by residents will not be required to be covered in protective encasement.

Non-Acceptable Materials

- Animal carcasses
- Asbestos
- Ash
- Automobiles or auto parts
- Chemical and/or petroleum cleanup waste
- Compressed cylinders of any size, shape or condition
- Construction and demolition (C&D) debris
- Drums, tanks, kegs and barrels (plastic and metal) greater than 55 gallons in size (unless the sides are removed and the vessel flattened prior to collection)
- Fencing/sheds/gazebos
- Glass
- Hazardous and bio-hazardous medical waste
- Home renovation/remodeling debris
- Household trash
- Liquids, including paint, sewage and septic waste
- Materials from evictions, foreclosures, unoccupied properties, commercial properties or apartment complexes
- Mirrors
- Plastic packing materials and plastic sheeting
- Radioactive material
- Riding lawnmowers
- Shingles, roofing materials
- Skids and pallets
- Soil, rocks, grubbing material and spoil
- Stumps and logs
- Windows
- Wood (unless it is a piece of furniture)
