How to Get a Certificate of Status

Why would I need a Certificate of Status?

When one is obtaining a license, a license renewal or a loan settlement, the person is often required to obtain a "Certificate of Status" (generally called a "good standing" certificate) from the Maryland Department of Assessments and Taxation. On the specific date and time the Department issues a certificate verifying that a business entity is in "good standing," it means that all documents and fees required by law to be submitted to the Department have been received, and that no other government agency has notified the Department that the entity is delinquent in tax payments.

How to purchase a Certificate on the Internet:

- You can obtain a certificate for a business entity registered with the Department by going to the Maryland Business Express website at
- Select the either link Business Entity Search, Certificate of Status & Document Order
- Enter the name of the business or department ID number
- Authenticity of Certificates purchased online can be verified on the system by choosing the Verify Certificate(s) of Status link

Other ways of getting a Certificate of Status:

Special Notes

- Certificates are not available for entities that do not have a Resident Agent, have not filed all Personal Property returns or have unpaid penalties.
- If an entity (business) is not in good standing with SDAT it is recommended that all issues be resolved before purchasing a certificate.
- Certificates are not available for trade names, name reservations, sole proprietorships, government entities and special entities such as public utilities, contact the Charter unit to discuss Departmental documentation options.
