How to Recognize and Eliminate A Rat Problem

You have a rat problem if you check either of the 2 boxes below:			
 □ I have seen either live rats, dead rats or signs of rats. □ My neighbors have seen live rats, dead rats or signs of rats. 			
Where to Look for Rats:	Under slabs or ground cover Under or around woodpiles. Under sheds or outbuildings Along walls of houses or buildings	Signs of Rats:	Rat burrows in ground Rat runs, rat droppings Gnaw marks (on doors, packaging, containers, etc.)

Five Steps to Get Rid of a Rat Problem: - Place the bait near rat signs: in burrows or 1. Find the rat food. Check against buildings. Look for rat food, such as: - Replenish bait every day for 10 days. If bait - Pet food left outside or bird feed on the ground gets wet, change it. - Pet feces on the ground - If rats do not eat bait within 3 days, change - Garbage or trash on the ground the location. - Open garbage can or cans with holes in them. - Keep children and pets away from bait. - Fallen fruit, vegetables or compost piles with garbage in them. 4. Check for live rats. Check - Bags of seed or pet food in garages or sheds. - After baiting for 10 days, test for signs of live 2. Get rid of the rat food. Check rats: kick dirt in rat burrows and check for reopened holes 1 day later. - Take pet food into the house after feeding (or -- If you find signs of live rats, continue baiting feed your pet indoors). for 5 more days. - Keep bird feed off ground by putting travs - Look for dead rats, and use shovel to under feeders. dispose of them in sealed plastic bags. - Put animal feces and trash into metal garbage Place the bags into garbage cans. cans. Close with tight-fitting lids. - Stay away from any live rats. - Rake up fruit and vegetables daily. Do not put garbage in compost piles. 5. Get rid of rat shelter. Check - Put dog food and bird seed stored in garages and sheds into covered metal containers. - Remove junked furniture, appliances and junked cars from your yard. 3. Bait for rats. Check - Mow down tall weeds and grass. - Stack lumber, building materials and - Buy boxes of standard rat bait at your local hardware store. firewood at least 18" above the ground. - Use bait according to instructions. - Fill in rat burrows with dirt and put lime - Protect bait from children, pets, and weather around the area. by placing it in cardboard.

- Rats can infest a large area. All neighbors must work together to get rid of rats.
