Prince George's County COVID-19 Vaccination and Rapid Test Kit Distribution Update

Dear Prince Georgians,

- The Prince George's County Health Department and the Office of Emergency Management will begin handing out 25,000 at-home rapid COVID-19 test kits at designated locations each week, in partnership with the Prince George's County Memorial Library System (PGMLS) and the Maryland-National Capital Park and Planning Commission (M-NCPPC).

- The test kits are free, regardless of insurance or immigration status. Residents will be required to show proof of County residency to receive a test kit. Examples of proof of residency include, but are not limited to, a driver’s license, utility bill, or lease agreement.
- One test kit, which contains 2 tests, will be distributed per person ages 2 years or older.
- Residents are strongly encouraged to take advantage of these new options to get tested, regardless of vaccination status.

- The County Health Department and Office of Emergency Management also continue to operate a COVID-19 testing clinic at the Bunker Hill Fire Station. Free COVID-19 testing is available to County residents Monday through Friday, 9:30 AM to 5:30 PM, on a walk-in basis only.
- In addition, the Maryland Department of Health has also opened and expanded several COVID-19 testing sites across the State. There are two new sites opening and one site being expanded in Prince George's County starting Monday, January 10:

- Due to the rise in COVID-19 cases, the County Health Department has seen a dramatic increase in vaccine demand, especially for booster doses. In addition, many upcoming athletic events have been cancelled. As a result, the County's COVID-19 vaccination clinic at Prince George's Community College is relocating back to the Sports and Learning Complex beginning Tuesday, January 11.
 - The hours of operation at the Sports and Learning Complex vaccination clinic are Mondays and Wednesdays from 9:00 AM to 8:00 PM, Tuesdays, Thursdays, and Fridays from 9:00 AM to 4:30 PM, and Saturdays from 10:00 AM to 4:00 PM.
 - Appointments are encouraged, but walk-ins are accepted.
- Based on the latest CDC guidance, the County Health Department is now offering booster shots of the Pfizer COVID-19 vaccine to youth ages 12 to 15. In addition, those who received the Pfizer vaccine initially should now receive a booster five months after their second dose.
- Based on the latest CDC guidance, the County Health Department is now offering third doses of the Pfizer COVID-19 vaccine to individuals ages 5 and up with weakened immune systems. Third doses for immunocompromised individuals should be administered 28 days after the second dose.
 - Free COVID-19 vaccines are also available at retail and grocery store pharmacies, urgent care facilities, and other health care providers in the County. - In collaboration with the County Health Department, Prince George's County Public Schools (PGCPS) continues to host free COVID-19 vaccination clinics at elementary schools.
 - County residents ages 5 and older can receive the COVID-19 vaccine at these clinics, including booster doses for individuals ages 12 and older. Schedule an appointment [here](#).

Test kits are free, regardless of insurance or immigration status. Residents are required to show proof of County residency (driver's license, utility bill, lease agreement) to receive a test kit.



BOOSTER SHOTS

AS OF JANUARY 2022

Pfizer-BioNTech, Moderna, Johnson & Johnson

WHO IS ELIGIBLE?

Individuals who received Pfizer and are 12 or older.

Individuals who received Moderna or Johnson & Johnson and are 18 and older.

WHEN CAN I GET IT?

At least 5 months after completing the primary dose series of Pfizer and at least 6 months after completing the primary dose series of Moderna.

At least 2 months after the single dose of Johnson & Johnson.

Eligible individuals who have a preference for a vaccine brand may choose which vaccine brand they receive as a booster dose.

DO I NEED TO SHOW PROOF OF ELIGIBILITY?

Individuals do not have to show proof of eligibility to receive a booster shot.

Booster shots of Moderna and Johnson & Johnson are not authorized for individuals under 18.

THIRD DOSE


BOOSTER DOSE

- For people who have moderately to severely weakened immune systems and are five and older if they received two doses of Pfizer, or 18 and older if they received two doses of Moderna.
- Can be received at least 28 days after second Pfizer or Moderna dose.
- Recommended because, in immunocompromised individuals, the first two doses may not offer enough protection.
- Pfizer recipients who are 12 or older; Moderna or Johnson & Johnson recipients who are 18 or older.
- Can be received at least five months after completing the primary dose series of Pfizer, at least six months after completing the primary dose series of Moderna, or at least two months after the single Johnson & Johnson dose.
- Needed when protection decreases over time.

Vaccine Supply & Administration



Data as of 1/7/21



- The County Health Department has provided over 208,000 vaccinations, including approximately 17,100 during the month of December.

- During the month of December, our mobile units have provided over 8,700 vaccinations in the community.
- Approximately 2,900 initial pediatric doses for ages 5 to 11 years, over 3,700 second pediatric doses, and over 8,900 additional or booster doses were given to County residents during the month of December.
- Throughout the last several weeks, we have continued to see an increase in vaccinations at County-led clinics due to additional doses provided, including third doses needed by immunocompromised residents and booster shots to increase immune response, as well as the recent authorization of the Pfizer vaccine for children ages 5 to 11 years and booster doses for young adults ages 16 and 17 years.

While the County Health Department now operates only one standing vaccination clinic in the County, in addition to nine mobile vaccination units, there are a number of vaccination sites available in Prince George's County that are not operated by the County. Please remember that we do not manage nor control appointments or distribution for any sites besides those operated by our County Health Department.



Progress Toward Vaccination Goals



- Over 1,320,600 vaccines have been provided to County residents. 623,510 County residents have received at least one dose of a vaccine.
- As of January 7, the CDC has reported 92.5% of adults ages 18 and older have received at least one vaccination in the County, and 79.3% are fully vaccinated.
- When including all residents ages 5 and older, 86.1% of residents have received at least one dose of a COVID-19 vaccine, according to the CDC.
- The CDC reports 31.1% of residents who are fully vaccinated have received a booster or additional dose as of January 7.
- Approximately 13.4% of County residents ages 5 to 9 years and 52.4% of County residents ages 10 to 19 years are fully vaccinated against COVID-19.
