



2016 TRANSFORMING NEIGHBORHOOD INITIATIVE (TNI) FUND FOR COMMUNITY INNOVATION AWARDS



Established in 2014 by the Office of the Prince George's County Executive and Prince George's County Public Schools, the TNI Fund provides general operating, program funding and capacity building support to community-based organizations providing quality free and/or affordable out-of-school programming for youth and families living in Prince George's County's TNI communities of Langley Park, East Riverdale/Bladensburg, Kentland/Palmer Park, Suitland/Coral Hills, Hillcrest Heights/Marlow Heights, and Glassmanor/Oxon Hill. In 2016, grants totaling \$142,000 were awarded to nonprofits serving Prince George's County, Maryland.
