CHARGES:

Allegedly, a large brown dog that is believed to be harbored or kept at Yuri Machuca's address is causing a public nuisance by barking excessively and disturbing the quiet of a person or neighborhood. Mr. McNair states that the owner is allegedly throwing the animal's feces into his yard and allowing the animal to defecate on his property while being walked. This is in violation of Section 3-131 'Manner of Keeping Animals; Prohibition of Nuisances', Section 3-134 'Excessive Noise by an Animal Prohibited', and Section 3-139 'Defecation; Removal of Excrement' of the Prince George's County Code.

v.

PETITION:

For return of custody of a twelve-year old female, blue and white, American Staffordshire Terrier named 'Lexie'. Allegedly Faye Chandler was found in violation of Section 3-135 'Animals at Large Prohibited', Section 3-136 'Vicious Animals', Section 3-145 'Ferret, Dog, and Cat Licenses', Section 3-185.01 'Pit Bull Terriers', and Section 3-186 'Vaccination of Ferrets, Dogs, and Cats' of the Prince George's County Code.

DENIA ESPINOZA

CHARGES:

Allegedly Denia Espinoza's dog, a male, white American Bulldog mix named 'Gino', escaped from her control and backyard resulting in Jeanette Smith's dog being attacked and sustaining injuries. Animal Services records indicate that the dog is current on rabies vaccination and county dog license. Your dog shows the propensity to be vicious by virtue of the alleged attack. This is in violation of Section 3-131 'Manner of Keeping Animals; Prohibition of Nuisances' and Section 3-136 'Vicious Animals' of the Prince George's County Code. times, resulting in injury. This is in violation of Section 3-131 'Manner of Keeping

Animals; Prohibition of Nuisance’, Section 3-135 ‘Animals at Large Prohibited’, and Section 3-136 ‘Vicious Animal’, and Section 3-175 ‘Attack Dogs’ of the Prince George’s County Code.

GENERAL RULES

Cases shall be called in the order in which they appear on the docket. The Commission may consider cases out of the order presented on the written docket, at the discretion of the Chairperson, to promote efficiency and as an accommodation to the parties involved.

All attempts will be made to allot time fairly to opposing parties and witnesses. However, all persons testifying under oath shall speak only after receiving recognition and consent of the Chairperson.

Hearings are open to the public. Verbal and physical disruptions from the public are prohibited. Members of the public are required to comply with rules, directives, and orders of the Commission.
