This is in violation of Section 3-131 'Manner of Keeping Animals', Section 3-135 'Animals at Large Prohibited' and Section 3-136 'Vicious Animals' of the Prince George's County Code.

CHARGE:

Allegedly on February 10, 2017, Rony Bustillo's male, sable, German Shepherd named 'Jake' was running at large and without provocation attacked and injured another dog. Your dog shows the propensity to be vicious by virtue of the alleged attack. This is in violation of Section 3-131 'Manner of Keeping Animals',

Section 3-135 'Animals at Large Prohibited', Section 3-136 'Vicious Animals' and Section 3-145 'Ferret, Dog, and Cat Licenses' of the Prince George's County Code.
