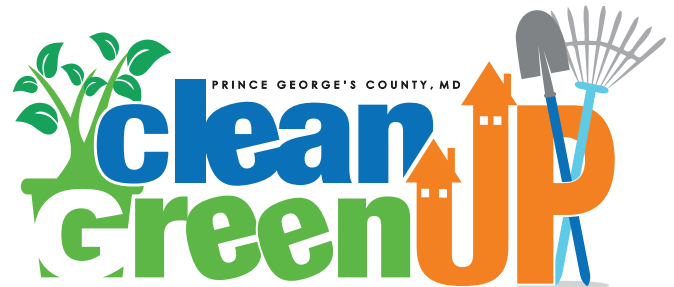

The following list is provided to guide your selection. Please indicate the number and type of plants you prefer. All efforts will be made to honor your request; however, if quantities are limited or species are not available at the time of planting, adjustments or substitutions may be necessary.

When requesting plants, please understand that up to 10 trees/shrubs or 20 perennials in addition to 50 daffodil bulbs will be supplied to each group. If you require a mix of plant materials, please request design assistance so we can provide a fair allocation of materials. Please do not plant tall trees under utility wires – restrict yourself to the smaller trees. Please note that materials are not intended for commercial use.

_____ **SOUTHERN MAGNOLIA**
Magnolia grandiflora. A gorgeous, hardy, evergreen shade tree. It has large, fragrant flowers in late spring into early summer, and bright red seeds in the fall. At maturity (20-50 year after it's planted) it will likely be 50'-60' tall.



_____ **SOUTHERN RED OAK**
Quercus falcata. A good shade tree that is tolerant of a lot of difficult environments. At maturity (20-50 years after it's planted) it will likely be 60'-80' tall.



_____ **'WINTER KING' WASHINGTON HAWTHORN**
Crataegus viridis 'Winter King'. This hardy, ornamental tree is an all-season beauty, with spring flowers that give way to coral-colored berries through the winter. Please note that this tree occasionally has small thorns. At maturity it will likely be 20'-30' tall.



_____ **ALLEGHENY SERVICEBERRY**
Amelanchier laevis. Small, deciduous flowering tree with multi-season interest: white flowers bloom in spring, berries in summer, and red leaves in fall. Thrives in sun and part shade. 15' - 25' tall at maturity.



_____ **'MOUNT AIRY' FOTHERGILLA**
Fothergilla gardenii 'Mount Airy'. This shrub has fun, bushy flowers in early spring and red to purplish fall color. Grows in full sun to part shade and prefers well-draining soil. 3'-5' tall at maturity.



_____ **HIGHBUSH BLUEBERRY**
Vaccinium corymbosum: Even if you don't eat the berries, this is a great shrub with great fall color. Prefers moist soil, but will tolerate occasional drought once well-established. Deer and other wildlife will enjoy the berries, too! Can be 5'-8' tall.



_____ **MOUNTAIN LAUREL**
Kalmia latifolia. This evergreen shrub has spring flowers that can be pale pink to purple. It prefers part shade, well-drained soil and doesn't like clay soils. You can encourage a bushy form by lightly pruning after it blooms. It will likely be 5'-10' tall, though it can get taller if in ideal growing conditions.



_____ **SOUTHERN BAYBERRY**
Morella cerifera: Evergreen shrub with aromatic green foliage and pale blue berries. Prefers full sun to light shade and typically grows 6'-12' tall. Needs constant moisture to get established, but afterwards is drought and flood tolerant.



_____ **BLACK-EYED SUSAN**
Rudbeckia fulgida. State flower for Maryland with yellow blooms in mid to late summer. Grows up to 2' tall. Prefers sun but will grow in quite a lot of shade.



_____ **'AUTUMN JOY' SEDUM**
Sedum 'Autumn Joy'. This sun-loving plant has large, fall flowers that bloom pink and age into bronze. It is very hardy and can grow near salted roads. They will grow 18"-24" tall and should be spaced about 18" apart.



_____ **WILD GERANIUM**
Geranium maculatum. Shade loving and colorful, this groundcover is easy to grow. The pink/purple flowers are complemented by textured leaves. It will grow about a foot tall and should be spaced 12" apart. If other foods are scarce, deer may browse.



_____ **FOAM FLOWER**
Tiarella cordifolia. Shade loving perennial groundcover. Has white, fuzzy flowers in early spring that get about 12" tall and the plant should be spaced 12"-24" apart. The leaves are beautiful!



_____ **LITTLE BLUESTEM**
Schizachyrium scoparium. Blue-tinged in spring and summer and fading from bronze to taupe in fall and winter, this clump-forming grass offers year-round interest. It prefers full sun and will grow from 2'-3' tall; space 18"-24" apart. Cut it back to a few inches tall in March—otherwise it's low maintenance!



_____ **BLUE FESCUE**
Festuca glauca. This sun-loving ornamental grass has a fine texture and a blue-gray color. It is tolerant of drought and roadside conditions. The clump-forming grass will get 6"-8" tall, though flower stalks may reach a foot. It should be spaced 8"-10" apart.



_____ **DAFFODIL BULBS**
Narcissus spp. Easy-to-grow spring flowering bulb; requires full sun or light shade. One bag has 50 bulbs. One (1) bag limit.

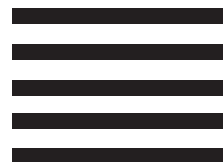
