





Introduction

- Servicing customers in 2020 during a global pandemic, provided a unique set of challenges for the Prince George's County Department of Public Works.
- During these unprecedented times, DPW&T remains committed to ensuring continued service to the communities we serves while bringing forth new innovations.



Enhanced Services

- TheBus increased frequencies from 90-minutes to 30-minutes on most routes on August 24, 2020
- On November 7, 2020, TheBus and Call-A-Bus introduced Saturday service for the first time since 1990
- On November 9, 2020, the Prince George's Link service launched in the Fort Washington/Oxon Hill Zone









Planned Upcoming Improvements

TheBus

- Launch the new Route 19, which merges the Route 12 Chillum Loop and Route 13 Loop B to serve Chillum and Brentwood
- Reinstate the Route 23 to serve the Sports & Learning Complex in Landover

PGC Link

 Launch new Prince George's Link service in Bowie/Laurel; Clinton/Marlton; Accokeek

Call-A-Bus/Call-A-Cab

- Launch Call-A-Bus next day reservations (previously 7-day)


Battery Electric Buses

- DPW&T received a Federal Transit Administration (FTA) Low or No Emissions grant to purchase four (4) electric buses and associated charging equipment
- The county partnered with Proterra to procure its first ever order of electric transit buses and charging equipment
- Proterra will deliver four (4) Proterra Catalyst E2 35 foot transit buses along with four (4) 125 kW charging stations
- Proterra estimates potential customer operational savings of up to \$400,000 per vehicle over the lifespan of the bus.
