

EQUIPMENT MECHANIC I

NATURE AND VARIETY OF WORK

This is entry level skilled mechanical work in the field of equipment maintenance, repair and service whereby incumbents work on a variety of light to medium sized motorized vehicles and equipment such as automobiles, vans, small trucks, and buses. Incumbents perform the more routine and less complex assignments. Work is performed under close supervision and is evaluated in terms of adherence to established work practices and procedures.

Upon the satisfactory completion of a probationary period, entry level employees may be non-competitively promoted to the II, full performance level at management's discretion.

EXAMPLES OF WORK (ILLUSTRATIVE ONLY)

Performs the more routine and less complex repair and maintenance assignments on motorized vehicles and equipment primarily within the light to medium categories.

Performs preventative maintenance assignments on all varieties of motorized equipment and vehicles.

Troubleshoots, diagnoses and effects repairs.

Repairs and replaces parts, components, and computerized systems.

May operate a tow truck and make on-site emergency repairs.

May perform lubrication and tire maintenance assignments.

Willingly and cooperatively performs tasks and duties which may not be specifically listed in the class specification or position description, but which are within the general occupational category and responsibility level typically associated with the employee's class of work.

REQUIRED KNOWLEDGES, SKILLS, ABILITIES

Knowledge of the standard tools, test equipment, methods and practices used in the repair and maintenance of light to medium motorized equipment and vehicles.

Knowledge of the internal components of engines, ignition, fuel injection, and other systems and components, including those computerized.

Ability to use standard tools and state-of-the-art diagnosis equipment.

Ability to detect and diagnose problems, make repairs and test repaired items.

Ability to operate a variety of light to medium motorized vehicles and motorized equipment.

MINIMUM QUALIFICATIONS

High School diploma or equivalent (GED), plus one (1) year of experience/training in the mechanical field servicing, repairing, and performing preventative maintenance on a variety of light to medium motorized vehicles equipment; or an equivalent combination of education, training, and experience that provides the required knowledges, skills and abilities.

CONDITIONS OF EMPLOYMENT

Possession of a valid driver's license.
