

EQUIPMENT SERVICE WORKER I

NATURE AND VARIETY OF WORK

This is entry-level semi-skilled and manual work in the field of equipment maintenance, repair, and service. Incumbents are engaged in preventative maintenance, lubrication, and the generalized servicing of a wide range of light, medium, and heavy motorized equipment, vehicles, and fire apparatus. Incumbents generally assist Heavy Equipment and Equipment Mechanics on the more routine and less complex assignments. On-the-job training is characteristic at this level, whereby incumbents may gain experience that will lead to higher level positions within the Equipment Mechanic occupational field. Work is performed in accordance with established departmental policies and procedures.

Upon the satisfactory completion of a probationary period, entry level incumbents may be non-competitively promoted to the II, full performance level at management's discretion.

EXAMPLES OF WORK (ILLUSTRATIVE ONLY)

Assists in servicing and lubricating a variety of motorized equipment, vehicles or fire and rescue apparatus in the light to heavy categories.

Assists in checking and changing oil and filters and fluid levels of transmissions, differentials and crankcases.

Assists in balancing, mounting, repairing, and replacing tires.

Assists mechanics on the more routine and less complex service and repair assignments.

Maintains and operates shop equipment.

Willingly and cooperatively performs tasks and duties which may not be specifically listed in the class specification or position description, but which are within the general occupational category and responsibility level typically associated with the employee's class of work.

REQUIRED KNOWLEDGES, SKILLS AND ABILITIES

Some knowledge of the standard tools, equipment, apparatus, and lubricants utilized in

mechanical work.

Some knowledge of the mechanical parts and functions of motorized equipment and engines.

Skills in the use of tools and equipment used for servicing and lubricating and for preventative maintenance.

Ability to make minor repairs and mechanical adjustments to equipment, apparatus and vehicles.

MINIMUM QUALIFICATIONS

At least an eighth (8) grade education or an equivalent combination of training, education or experience, plus some experience in servicing and performing preventative maintenance on a variety of light, medium or heavy motorized equipment, vehicles, or fire, and rescue apparatus; or an equivalent combination of education, training and experience.

CONDITIONS OF EMPLOYMENT

Good physical condition.

Valid driver's license.
