

EQUIPMENT SERVICE WORKER II

NATURE AND VARIETY OF WORK

This is full performance level semi-skilled manual and mechanical work in the field of equipment maintenance, repair and service. Incumbents are engaged in the more routine service, maintenance and repair on a variety of light to heavy motorized equipment, vehicles, or fire and rescue apparatus. Incumbents at this level make mechanical adjustments; perform lubrication and tire maintenance; assist in the less complex repair assignments; and may tow or operate a mobile service/lubrication unit in all types of weather. Work is performed in accordance with established departmental policies and procedures, under general supervision and is evaluated in terms of work production, timeliness and successful completion of assignments.

EXAMPLES OF WORK (ILLUSTRATIVE ONLY)

Services, lubricates and greases a variety of light to heavy motorized equipment, vehicles, or fire and rescue apparatus.

Checks and changes oil, filters and fluid levels of transmissions, differentials, crankcases, and etc.

Balances, mounts, repairs, replaces tires and assists mechanics on the less complex repair assignments.

May drive/test equipment, vehicles, apparatus in conjunction with preventive maintenance programs.

Maintains, operates, and/or uses shop equipment and tools.

Makes minor and routine mechanical adjustments and repairs.

May operate a tow truck or mobile service/lubrication unit and make on-site minor emergency repairs.

Willingly and cooperatively performs tasks and duties which may not be specifically listed in the class specification or position description, but which are within the general occupational category and responsibility level typically associated with the employee's class of work.

REQUIRED KNOWLEDGES, SKILLS AND ABILITIES

Knowledge of the standard tools, equipment, apparatus, and lubricants utilized in mechanical work.

Knowledge of the mechanical parts and functions of motorized equipment and engines.

Skill in the use of tools and equipment used in servicing, lubricating and for preventative maintenance.

Ability to operate a tow truck or mobile service/lubrication unit.

Ability to make minor repairs and mechanical adjustments.

MINIMUM QUALIFICATIONS

Must possess at least an eighth (8th) grade education or an equivalent combination of training, education or experience, plus six (6) months of experience in service and performing preventative maintenance on a variety of light, medium or heavy motorized equipment, vehicles or fire and rescue apparatus.

CONDITIONS OF EMPLOYMENT

Good physical condition.

Valid driver's license.
