1 IN 52 PRINCE GEORGE'S COUNTY MEN AGES 30-39 ARE LIVING WITH HIV

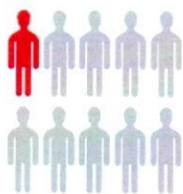

In 2017, Prince George's County had the highest number of new HIV diagnoses in the state.

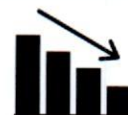
# 7,361

**1 OUT OF EVERY 102** people (ages 13 and older) in the county have been diagnosed with HIV.

# 320

county residents were diagnosed with HIV in 2017. The number of new cases decreased from **392 new cases in 2015**.

Seven out of every ten new HIV diagnoses in the county are men.



**1 IN 73** male residents are HIV+.

Most people living with HIV in the county are Black or African American.
