

ICS-300: Intermediate ICS for Expanding Incidents

What is ICS-300?

ICS-300 examines NIMS Command and Management components and how they support the management of expanding incidents or planned events. Students will learn the incident/event management process as prescribed by the Incident Command System (ICS). Students will implement the incident management process on a simulated expanding incident and develop an Incident Action Plan (IAP).

Who should take ICS 300?

Individuals who are expected to perform in a supervisory or tactical level management role during an incident or event. Persons serving as command staff, section chiefs, strike team leaders, task force leaders, unit leaders, division/group supervisors, branch directors, and multi-agency coordination system/emergency operations center staff.

Prerequisites - IS 700, IS800, ICS 100*, ICS 200 **

*There are 8 different ICS 100 course offerings which includes a general course designed for all disciplines and 8 that target specific classes of work. You are free to complete the 100 level course of your choice.

**ICS 200 has two offerings. One is applicable to all disciplines and the other is designed for healthcare organizations. You are free to complete the 200 level course of your choice.
