

ICS-400: Advanced ICS Command and General Staff-Complex Incidents

What is ICS-400?

ICS-400 examines how major incidents pose special management challenges and discusses the circumstances in which an Area Command and or multi-agency coordination systems are established. Additionally, the roles and relationships of primary staff, considerations related to large and complex incident or event management, and the importance of interagency coordination will be discussed.

Who should take ICS 400?

Individuals that serve in a command or general staff capacity in an ICS organization, department heads with multi-agency coordination system responsibilities, area commanders, emergency managers, and multi-agency coordination system/emergency operations center managers and key personnel. Persons responsible for incident/event management policy development or who coordinate response resources with regional, state, or federal response partners should also consider attending this course.

Prerequisites - IS 700, IS800, ICS 100*, ICS 200 ** , ICS 300 or equivalent

*There are 8 different ICS 100 course offerings which includes a general course designed for all disciplines and 8 that target specific classes of work. You are free to complete the 100 level course of your choice.

**ICS 200 has two offerings. One is applicable to all disciplines and the other is designed for healthcare organizations. You are free to complete the 200 level course of your choice.
