- Have you used drugs or alcohol during your pregnancy?
- Are you a teenager?
- Are you unsure about how to care for your baby?
- Was your baby born early (premature)?
- Did the doctor say your baby has special problems and may need special care?
- Is it hard for you to feed or play with your baby?
- Do you love your baby but feel like baby care is just too much?
- Does it sometimes feel like your baby will never stop crying?
- Do drugs or alcohol keep you from caring for your baby?
- Is it hard to make ends meet because of the new baby?
- Is it hard to get to medical appointments because you lack transportation?
- Does your baby need basic baby supplies?
