PAINTER II

NATURE AND VARIETY OF WORK

This is full performance skilled level painting work within the skilled craft occupational category. Incumbents perform the full range of painting assignments necessary to accomplish both interior and exterior painting work. Work is performed under the general supervision of an administrative superior. Work performance is evaluated in terms of quantity and quality of production.

EXAMPLES OF WORK (ILLUSTRATIVE ONLY)

Performs the full range of painting duties and responsibilities.

Participates in the preparation of interior or exterior surfaces for painting by removing fixtures, nails, wire-brushing, sanding, and painting.

Participates in both roller, or spray painting of interior or exterior surface and trim.

Determines type of paint most suitable for specific surfaces and articulates findings to subordinate painters.

Ensures that paint assignments meet proper color requirements.

Paints building furniture and equipment, including desks, chairs, tables, filing cabinets, boiler rooms, and other items.

Consults with supervisor or other officials as necessary to determine interior and exterior colors as well as to determine best painting schedule in order to least interfere with government operations.

Participates in puttying windows and caulking or spackling sheet rock including taping and finishing, plaster, and other wall surfaces preparatory to painting.

Participates in dry wall taping and finishing prior to painting.

Participates in rigging of a variety of types of scaffolding as necessary to reach any and all interior surfaces to be painted.

Completes service requests as far as materials used and work accomplished.

Maintains logs and other preventive maintenance records in good retrievable order.

Participates in planning, scheduling, estimating and purchasing paints and equipment for various painting assignments.

Willingly and cooperatively performs tasks and duties which may not be specifically listed in the class specification or position description, but which are within the general occupational category and responsibility level typically associated with the employee's class of work.

KNOWLEDGES, SKILLS AND ABILITIES

Considerable knowledge of the methods, materials, tools and practices of the painting trade.

Considerable knowledge of the hazards and safety precautions of painting work.

Considerable knowledge of paint types, textures and colors.

Skills in the use and care of paint brushes, rollers, and spray guns.

Ability to work at considerable heights from scaffolding.

Ability to understand and follow oral and written instructions.

Ability to keep accurate and retrievable records.

MINIMUM QUALIFICATIONS

Graduation from high school or GED equivalent plus one (1) year of painting experience; or an equivalent combination of training and experience.

CONDITIONS OF EMPLOYMENT

Good physical condition.

Possession of a valid driver's license.

Willingness to respond to emergency service calls on a 24-hour basis.

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
