

PAINTER III

NATURE AND VARIETY OF WORK

This is lead/supervisory work within the skilled craft occupational category. Incumbents lead/supervise subordinate painters in accomplishing painting assignments within the County, including both interior and exterior surface and trim work. Work is performed under general supervision, and performance is evaluated in terms of quantity and quality of production.

EXAMPLES OF WORK (ILLUSTRATIVE ONLY)

Leads/supervises the work of subordinates in painting activities.

Coordinates the preparation of interior or exterior surfaces for painting.

Plans, schedules, estimates and purchases paints and equipment to complete assigned work projects.

Determines types of paint most suitable for specific surfaces; ensures that painting assignments meet proper color assignments.

Supervises and participates in brush roller, or spray painting of interior or exterior surfaces and trim.

Consults with supervisor or other officials as necessary to determine desired colors as well as to determine best painting schedules for effective utilization of time and resources.

Participates in puttying windows and caulking or spackling sheet rock including taping and finishing, plaster, and other wall surfaces before painting.

Participates in dry wall taping and finishing prior to painting and rigs a variety of types of scaffolding interior surfaces to be painted.

Reads and interprets service requests.

Maintains logs and other preventive maintenance records in good retrievable order.

Willingly and cooperatively performs tasks and duties which may not be specifically listed in the class specification or position description, but which are within the general occupational category and responsibility level typically associated with the employee's class of work.

KNOWLEDGES, SKILLS AND ABILITIES

Thorough knowledge of the methods, materials, tools and practices of the painting trade.

Thorough knowledge of the hazards and safety precautions of painting work.

Thorough knowledge of paint types, textures, and colors.

Ability to work at considerable heights from scaffolding.

Ability to lead/supervise the work of subordinate painters.

Ability to understand and follow oral and written instructions.

Ability to maintain good work relationship with all levels of employees and the general public.

MINIMUM QUALIFICATIONS

Graduation from an accredited high school or possession of a GED certificate plus three (3) years of experience in painting work; or an equivalent combination of experience and training.

CONDITIONS OF EMPLOYMENT

Good physical condition.

Possession of a valid driver's license.

Willingness to respond to emergency service calls on a 24-hour basis.
