EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

A. What is the CAPER?

The Prince George's County *FY 2015 Consolidated Annual Performance and Evaluation Report (CAPER)* is the vehicle used to highlight the County's achievements in providing decent housing, suitable living environments, and expanding economic opportunities specifically targeting low and moderate-income persons and households during the reporting period.

The *CAPER* also includes measures taken during the year to implement the County's *2011-2015 Consolidated Plan* along with a narrative summary of federal programmatic accomplishments. It also provides quantitative analyses of the successes in meeting outlined goals.

B. Annual Accomplishments

Three goals were identified in the County's *2011 – 2015 Consolidated Plan*. The County's Fiscal Year (FY) 2015 accomplishment details marked the end of its 5-year strategy to address these goals. As a result of the County's efforts, the following accomplishments were met.

Goal 1: To stabilize and increase housing opportunities for 969 low and moderate-income households, homeless individuals and families, persons at risk of becoming homeless and non-homeless persons with special needs. In FY 2015, the County assisted 1,370 households.

Goal 2: To improve the safety and livability of neighborhoods for principally 37,995 low and moderate-income persons. In FY 2015, the County assisted 18,216 persons.

Goal 3: To support employment opportunities for low and moderate-income persons, small businesses, and community revitalization activities by creating and/or retaining 46 jobs and assisting 177 small businesses. In FY 2015, the County created and/or retained 335 jobs and assisted 69 small businesses.

I. SUMMARY OF RESOURCES

In FY 2015, the County used over \$80 million in the following federal, state, local and private funds for furthering the objectives in the Annual Action Plan. (See table below)

II. GENERAL CAPER NARRATIVES

A. Assessment of the Five-Year Goals and Objectives

Specific objectives were developed to address the County's priority needs. Each objective was identified by number and contains proposed accomplishments, the time period and annual program year numeric goals.

The following table (HUD Table 2C) is a summary of the specific objectives which includes a comparison of the County's expected number to the actual outcomes for FY 2015. A summary of the activities and accomplishment details is reported in Attachment A – FY 2015 Accomplishment Details.

Decent Housing

The County considers renters with income between 0-50 percent of the median family income (MFI) and owners with income between 0-80 percent MFI a high priority and renters between 51-80 percent MFI a medium priority. These households experience more "housing problems" such as "cost burden" greater than 30 percent of the median family income and overcrowding and substandard housing conditions. The County does not address the housing needs for middle to high-income households (greater than 80 percent MFI) because it does not meet the national objective criteria described by HUD and is therefore not eligible for HUD funds (e.g., HOME, ESG, CDBG, HOPWA, etc.)

During FY 2015, the County used its federal, state, local, and private funds for activities (e.g., homeowner rehabilitation loans, down payment and closing cost assistance, rental subsidies, etc.) that addressed the "unmet needs" of households that were identified as high priority.

Suitable Living Environment

Public Facilities and Infrastructure

The cost of needed public facilities and infrastructure improvements (street resurfacing, sidewalks, sewer, community centers, health facilities, and etc.) is significant for 34 low and moderate-income communities in the County, particularly those in the established communities due to the gaining and need to be repaired. The goal is to leverage CDBG funds to improve and/or expand access to facilities and infrastructure to at least 149,119 residents of the County by FY 2015. To date, the County assisted 218,885 households, which is 146 percent of its 5-year goal.

Public Services

Public services address the health and safety concerns of the County's low and moderate-income and other populations such as at-risk children, youth and families, seniors and frail elderly, persons with disabilities, immigrants, homeless individuals and families, and ex-offenders re-entering the County.

The goal is to leverage CDBG funds to support activities and programs that are essential to improving the quality of life for at least 54,164 residents of the County by FY 2015. To date, the County has achieved 141 percent of its 5-year goal by providing new and/or improved services to 76,388 individuals. (See table on next page)

Economic Opportunities

There is a need to improve the delivery of technical information and financing to small businesses and new entrepreneurs. Both small and medium sized businesses need a trained work force. Workers in the County at all income levels, but particularly low and moderate-income workers, lack access to employment opportunities because they do not have the required skills. The County proposed to leverage CDBG funds to expand employment opportunities for at least 230 residents, and increase the affordable options for at least 343 existing and new businesses, and stabilize and expand 670 small businesses in revitalization areas by FY 2015. To date, with the use of CDBG funds the County has created and/or retained 962 jobs, exceeding its 5-year goal, assisted 195 small businesses, and 393 existing and new businesses in revitalization areas.

B. Affirmatively Furthering Fair Housing

Affirmatively Furthering Fair Housing is one of applicable statutes, regulations, and certifications requirements governing the Federal Grant request process. A major requirement of Affirmatively Furthering Fair Housing is that the applying jurisdiction certifies that it will conduct an analysis of impediments to fair housing choice within the jurisdiction, take appropriate actions to overcome the effects of any impediments identified through the analysis, and maintain records reflecting that analysis and actions in this regard.

Prince George's County thru its Consolidated Plan has identified the need to eliminate barriers to affordable housing. The County is currently developing an all-out effort to develop strong and cohesive neighborhoods and communities where people of all race, creed, color and gender are ensured equal housing opportunities. The effort is to develop strong accountable neighborhoods and communities by fostering the development of a strong leadership structure and supporting the community government structure as to enhance the services and living environments of the communities. This effort will be directed by the expansion of economic opportunities, the provision of decent housing and the creation of suitable living environments.

Actions Taken to Affirmatively Furthering Fair Housing

The County continues to promote its Fair Housing and Equal Opportunity effort In FY 2015. This effort is directed at improving the County's position addressing discrimination in housing and related Economic Opportunity matters. The County directly sponsored a series of workshops and public forums across the County. There were two such forums which were directed at providing Fair Housing information and assistance with the purchase of homes. Thousands of persons attended these occasions which targeted first time homebuyers. There were two additional forums which addressed the high need for assistance to homeowners facing property foreclosures. Financial institutions, banks, mortgage companies, legal representatives and additional vendors attended and provided information to the public.

Department of Housing and Community Development

In FY 2015, the Prince George's County Department of Housing and Community Development (DHCD) participated in numerous activities that affirmatively furthered fair housing. The largest event sponsored by DHCD is the annual Housing Fair. This year over 50 exhibitors were on hand at the Sports and Learning Complex in Landover, MD to talk with fair attendees about buying homes, foreclosure mitigation, renting opportunities and more. Over 2,500 people came out to meet with housing industry

professionals and participate in workshops on topics such as: a panel discussion entitled, “Ask the Experts.” The discussion included topics on: Understanding the Value of Your Home and Knowing Your Options if Your House is “Underwater.” Homeowners were encouraged to attend this discussion to receive free expert advice on the value of their home and what options are available if their house is underwater or if the home owner is facing foreclosure.

The Redevelopment Authority of Prince George's County remodeled a, 100 year-old home, designed to provide superior energy savings, water efficiency and a healthy living environment. The home produced as much energy as it consumes, minimizing the utility bill to virtually zero. The house meets *Energy Star* and *LEED* Platinum Standards. The home was selected as the 2015 Green Build Offsite Educational Tour Site by Green Build International Conference and Expo.

Housing Fair attendees had the opportunity to meet with housing industry professionals, such as mortgage lenders, realtors, rental property managers, housing counselors, banks, non-profit organizations and various government agencies. The Fair also included workshops on financial literacy, avoiding housing scams, first-time home buyer programs, managing your money and more. The Maryland Department of Housing and Community Development will facilitated the opportunity for major mortgage bank servicers to discuss options with homebuyers trying to avoid foreclosure.

Another one of DHCD’s first time homebuyers program, “My HOME” homeownership program uses HOME funds to provide homeownership assistance to low and moderate income buyers to purchase residential properties *anywhere* in Prince George’s County, MD. Income eligible, first time homebuyers can obtain a 0% interest deferred payment loan for up to 5% of the purchase price, only as needed. This program serves to enhance the commitment of Prince Georges County Government to provide equal and affordable housing opportunities to low and moderate income persons. In the fiscal year one hundred ten (110) My HOME settlements were completed. The My HOME Program is implemented in partnership with over 50 participating lenders, the Prince George’s County Association of Realtors and HUD certified housing counseling agencies.

Efforts Taken to Enforce Local Fair Housing Laws and Reduce Fair Housing Complaints

Federal Government Efforts

Residents of Prince George’s County are also encouraged to file fair housing complaints with the Fair Housing and Equal Opportunity (FHEO) Office of the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD). FHEO administers federal laws and establishes national policies that make sure that all Americans have equal access to the housing of their choice. The Department of Housing and Community Development makes a concerted effort to partnership with HUD. The following table is a listing of the Fair Housing complaints filed with HUD during the County’s FY 2015.

Local Government Efforts

The Department of Housing and Community Development continues to provide funding to the County's Human Relation Commission for the direct purpose of increasing outreach and education to residents regarding their rights when it comes to fair housing and fair lending. The Human Relations Commission is the County's civil rights education and enforcement agency. The thirteen member commission has the authority to investigate and adjudicate complaints of discrimination in housing. And, although the County's local ordinance is not substantially equivalent with the Federal Fair Housing laws, it is still very robust and offers protections greater than many jurisdictions in the State of Maryland, without substantially equivalent statutes.

The Prince George's County Human Relations Commission (HRC) is the county's civil rights education and enforcement agency. Its Commissioners independently receive and review charges of discrimination brought by its Executive Director. The Executive Director leads a staff of investigators who investigate claims of discrimination. Staff receive complaints of discrimination in housing among other areas and has the authority to investigate those complaints fully, and if a negotiated settlement is not appropriate or successful, the Executive Director of the Commission is empowered to file civil charges against the alleged violator and request a public hearing before the Commission, whose function it is to determine whether discrimination occurred and if so found, to award damages up to \$200,000, levy fines up to \$10,000 and order additional sanctions against violators, with the aim of hopefully correcting discriminatory behavior. For the first time in several years, the Commission has had a full complement of Commissioners between FY 2014 and the start of FY2015 on July 1, 2014.

Analysis of Impediments (AI) to Fair Housing Choice

The Prince George's Human Relations Commission uses its CDBG funds to oversee the completion of an updated Analysis of Impediments (AI) Study developed by consultant's Mullin and Lonergan of Pittsburg, Pennsylvania. During FY 2014, the Commission staff held briefings with County officials and departments in anticipation of approval by the County Council with an implementation plan. The Draft AI Study was transmitted to the County Executive in September 2013 for County Council's approval and adoption in November 2013. The Human Relations Commission has been asked to take an active role in drafting the Prince George's County Fair Housing Plan and submitting recommendations for the County's update to its Consolidated Plan.

Commission Accomplishments and Activities

The Commission is also charged with the responsibility to educate and train residents, property owners and other housing stakeholders on Fair Housing practices in accordance with the Fair Housing Act and other HUD guidance. Each year the Commission and staff participate in the DHCD Annual Housing Fair. In June 2015, the Commission and staff manned a booth and provided one-on-one interview opportunities for potential complainants and distributed materials aimed at educating the over three thousand attendees about the Commission's mission to eradicate discrimination through education and aggressive enforcement of the County's laws barring discrimination in Housing, Employment, Education, Law Enforcement Conduct, Public Accommodations, Real Estate transactions and Financial Lending.

For FY 2015, the Commission staff processed 10 complaints of housing discrimination. Although many of the cases are found to have insufficient basis for moving to adjudication and were dismissed, the education initiatives regarding civil rights in housing continues to result in more citizens looking for assistance and more cases for initial interview than in the previous year. One of the current open cases involves mortgage lending discrimination.

The Commission in FY 2015 averaged 26 intake interviews per month for complaints of discrimination in all areas. Housing discrimination complaints accounted for over 5% of the cases approved for investigation. In FY 2015, the Commission plans to conduct testing in the area of mortgage lending in Prince George's County as part of new enforcement measures aimed at eliminating discrimination in mortgage lending in the County. This type of investigation was one of the recommendations of the Analysis of Impediments Study. In addition, the Commission prepares and submits comments, where appropriate on legislation which impacts civil rights in the county.

In addition to community engagement, enforcement and research, the Commission is dedicated to ensuring proper training for its investigators and has enrolled all investigators in the 5-week Fair Housing Training Course offered by NFHTA. To date, all agency investigators have completed the entire 5 week course leading to certification after an exam, to be scheduled. Completion of the training will be a precursor to the Commission's application for interim FHAP status with the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development.

The Commission is also charged with the responsibility to educate and train residents, property owners and other housing stakeholders on Fair Housing practices in accordance with the Fair Housing Act and other HUD guidance.

Additional Fair Housing Support Activities

In FY 2015 Prince George's County continued to use Federal Funds to provide rehabilitation loans and grants to rehabilitate existing housing units, including vacant and abandoned houses for low and moderate-income households. Funds were used to correct health and safety, code violations, including preservation needs.

The Department of Housing and Community Development provided funding to non-profit agencies which provided residents of the County with assistance – in regards to instances of discrimination in the process of searching for rental properties or during the process of buying, seeking mortgages, insuring of homes, and who are facing foreclosures.

Agency Statistics for FY 2014

- HOPE – is a housing counseling agency which has used CDBG funds to provide foreclosure intervention assistance to 1,084 persons. They have also provided financial literacy and credit rebuilding educational services.
- Greater Washington Urban League – used federal funds to provide housing counseling services to 400 individuals in Prince George's County. Individuals were offered pre-occupancy and mortgage default services. Residents also received assistance with other housing matters such as predatory lending.
- DHCD – used CDBG funds to complete rehabilitation of twenty-one (21) homes for low to moderate-income households.

The County also provided emergency housing opportunities thru the Emergency Solutions Grant program. The ESG funds were used to address the priority needs, goals and objectives described in the County's 2011-2015 Consolidated Plan. The funds were distributed through contracts with several private non-profit agencies.

Affirmatively Further Fair Housing is a part of the applicable statutes and the regulations governing the consolidated plan regulations. The jurisdiction certifies that it will conduct an analysis of impediments to fair housing choice within the jurisdiction, take appropriate actions to overcome the effects of any impediments identified through the analysis, and maintain records reflecting that analysis and actions in this regard.

Prince George's County thru its Consolidated Plan has identified the need to eliminate barriers to affordable housing. The County is currently developing an all out effort to develop strong and cohesive neighborhoods and communities where people of all race, creed, color and gender are ensured equal housing opportunities. The effort is to develop strong accountable neighborhoods and communities by fostering the development of a strong leadership structure and supporting the community government structure as to enhance the services and living environments of the

communities. This effort will be directed by the expansion of economic opportunities, the provision of decent housing and the creation of suitable living environments.

C. Affordable Housing

Addressing Affordable Housing (As Defined by Section 215)

According to the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD), the generally accepted definition of affordability is for a household to pay no more than 30 percent of its annual income on housing. Families who pay more than 30 percent of their income for housing are considered cost burdened and may have difficulty affording necessities such as food, clothing, transportation, and medical care.

HUD Table 3B provides the actual number of households the County served by the various (e.g. rehabilitation of existing units, homebuyer assistance, and rental assistance) during FY 2015 with CDBG, HOME, and ESG funds.

In FY 2015, the County used CDBG, HOME, and ESG funds to provide affordable housing to 311 households to extremely low and special needs renters and homeowners. Fifty-eight percent (or 180 households/renters) served were for the County's special needs population (e.g. seniors, persons with disabilities and persons at risk of becoming homeless) and forty-two percent (or 131 households) were for owners. Addressing the Worst-case Needs

Households with extremely low-income (0-30 percent of their median family income) and who spend more than half of their income on housing are considered under-served and have the “worst-case needs”. The majority of these households are renters.

In FY 2015¹, the following programs were made available to address the extremely low-income households.

Veterans Affairs Supportive Housing Program (VASH)

The VASH program assists honorably discharged homeless veterans who reside in Prince George’s County. These vouchers are issued based on referrals from the U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs Medical Center. This program is by referral only by the U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs Medical Center (VAMC).

Veterans Assistance Program (VET)

The VET program assists homeless veterans from Prince George’s County as identified by the Department of Social Services and the VAMC homeless program. This program is by referral only by the Department of Social Services and the VAMC homeless program.

Violence Against Women Act Program (VAWA)

The VAWA program assists victims of domestic violence identified by the Family Crisis Center, INC., of Prince George’s County, Safe Passage Program Emergency Shelter. This program is by referral only by the Family Crisis Center.

Housing for Families in Crisis Program (HFIC)

The HFIC program assists families identified by the Department of Social Services, Community Services Division. This program is by referral only by the Department of Social Services, Community Services Division.

Mental Illness and Disabilities Program (MIAD)

The MIAD program assists persons with a mental illness and/or a disability identified by the Department of Family Services. This program is by referral only by the Department of Family Services.

Housing Choice Voucher Program (HCV)

The Housing Authority of Prince George's County, Rental Assistance Division administers the HUD funded Housing Choice Voucher Program. Eligible participants are issued vouchers to obtain affordable housing in the private rental market for their families.

Housing Choice Voucher Homeownership Program

The Housing Choice Voucher Homeownership Program has been extremely successful in helping program participants reach their goal of becoming a first-time homebuyer.

Family Unification Program (FUP)

The Family Unification Program provides housing choice voucher rental assistance to reunite families when children are placed in foster care or when parents are in imminent danger of separation from their children due to a lack of adequate housing. This program is by referral only from the Department of Social Services when funding is available.

Family Unification Program for Foster Care (FFC)

This Family Unification Program provides housing choice voucher rental assistance for persons who are at least 18 years old and not more than 21 years old who left foster care and who do not have adequate housing. FUP vouchers used by youth are limited, by statute to 18 months of housing assistance. This program is by referral only by the Department of Social Services.

Family Self Sufficiency Program (FSS)

Families who receive housing choice voucher assistance are eligible to participate in the Housing Choice Voucher Family Self Sufficiency program. Family Self Sufficiency is a voluntary program helping housing choice voucher participant families become economically self-sufficient. The Housing Authority and the head of each participating family execute an FSS contract of participation that specifies the rights and responsibilities of both parties. The 5-year FSS contract specifies goals and services for each family. Family members must fulfill all requirements in order to obtain full benefits.

An interest-bearing FSS escrow account is established by the Housing Authority for each participating family. An escrow credit, based on increases in earned income of the family, is credited to this account by the Housing Authority during the term of the FSS contract. The Housing Authority may make a portion of this escrow account available to the family during the term of the contract to enable the family to complete an interim goal such as education.

If the family completes the contract and no member of the family is receiving cash welfare assistance, the amount of the FSS account is paid to the family. These funds are often used for homeownership, continuing education, and to starting a business. If

the Housing Authority terminates the FSS contract, or if the family fails to complete the contract before its expiration, the family's FSS escrow funds are forfeited.

Rental Allowance Program (RAP)

The Rental Allowance Program is a homeless housing assistance program funded by the State of Maryland and administered through the Maryland Department of Housing and Community Development, Community Development Administration (CDA). Prince George's County has been awarded grants since 1990, and the Housing Authority of Prince George's County administers the program.

Housing Choice Voucher Portability Program

Portability is a feature of the Housing Choice Voucher program that allows an eligible family with a Housing Choice Voucher to use that voucher to lease a unit anywhere in the United States where there is a Public Housing Agency (PHA) operating a Housing Choice Voucher program. Portability refers to the transfer of a household within the Housing Choice Voucher program from one jurisdiction to another. The decision to move is made by the housing choice voucher participant.

Landlord Seminars

Each month, the Rental Assistance Division conducts landlord outreach through their Landlord Seminars. During these seminars landlords receive detailed information regarding the Housing Choice Voucher program regulations and operations with emphasis on landlord responsibilities to the family; to the program and inspection requirements. Landlords are advised on the significance of their communication between RAD Inspectors and Rental Specialists.

D. Continuum of Care

The Prince George's County Continuum of Care for homeless persons is coordinated through the County's Homeless Services Partnership (HSP). The HSP is responsible for needs assessments, gap analysis, service coordination, resource development, drafting and adoption of policy, and system performance evaluation of all homeless services. Membership includes over 100 public and private agencies, faith-based organizations, service providers, mainstream programs, consumers and concerned citizens which meet from 2 pm – 4pm on the 2nd Thursday of every month. The HSP establishes strategic priorities, approves decisions by vote, developed and oversees implementation of the County's "Ten Year Plan to Prevent and End Homelessness in Prince George's County; 2012-2021", and is the local Homeless Advisory Board for the County Executive. The Prince George's County Department of Social Services (PGCDSS) serves as the CoC's local administering agency for federal, state and county funding for homeless services, including the annual U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development Homeless Continuum of Care grant application process.

The County's strategic plan was derived from best practices evolving locally as well as from communities nationwide and focuses on six (6) key strategies that have proven to be effective in reducing homelessness: 1. coordinated entry, 2. prevention assistance, 3. shelter diversion, 4. rapid re-housing, 5. permanent housing, and 6. improved data collection and performance measures. In addition, accommodations were made for six (6) subpopulations that have distinct needs requiring separate exploration: 1. homeless or at-risk unaccompanied youth, 2. veterans, 3. chronically homeless, 4. mentally ill, substance abusing or dually diagnosed persons and/or disabled individuals, 5. domestic violence survivors, and 6. returning residents. The strategies are carefully designed to achieve purposeful and intentional reduction in the incidents of homelessness and collectively they form a plan that aligns County efforts with federal goals, shifts system focus from "shelter" to "housing", prioritizes programming for special populations, enhances system accountability, builds on current success, and provides new flexibility and opportunity.

Actions Taken to Prevent Homelessness:

The County's CoC provides prevention services through a network of public, private, non-profit, and faith-based organizations. These network providers offer financial assistance to pay security deposits and first month's rent as well as eviction prevention and foreclosure assistance. The following chart lists resources used in the County's homelessness prevention effort (including utility assistance since it allows low-income households to redirect income toward rent or other household priorities:

E. Other Actions

Obstacles Meeting the Underserved Needs

Lack of funding remains the largest obstacle to meeting underserved housing needs. To address this issue, the County leverages its limited resources by encouraging and forming partnerships with many nonprofit and for-profit organizations, by applying for HUD grants, and by accessing State of Maryland funding sources for economic development projects, home ownership, housing rehabilitation, public services, and homeless services.

Fostering and Maintaining Affordable Housing

Due to the increase in population, the County is confronted with many housing issues. The supply of affordable quality housing for low to moderate-income households is insufficient.

The County’s approach to fostering and maintaining affordable housing is to rehabilitate the existing aging housing stock in order to create more quality affordable housing. This is done by:

- leveraging HOME, CDBG, and CDAs MD Mortgage funds to purchase and rehabilitate deteriorated properties;

- using an array of other federal, state, local and private dollars to steadily improve aging multi-family rental complexes and single-family homes;
- acquiring and demolishing properties when rehabilitation is not feasible or desirable; and
- replacing housing for more viable options.

Eliminating Barriers to Affordable Housing

In FY 2015, with the use of federal, state, and local government funds, as well as private funds, the following efforts were taken to remove barriers to obtaining affordable housing in the County.

- The Single Family Bond Financing Program operated in partnership with Maryland's Community Development Administration (CDA) loan program to provide low interest mortgage loans to first-time homebuyers. More favorable rates were available to persons who purchased homes in targeted neighborhoods. Down payment and closing cost assistance were made available as well.
- The Housing Rehabilitation Assistance Program assisted County residents with bringing their homes into compliance with state and county codes. Eligible activities included replacement of roofs, gutters, windows, floors; accessibility improvements for disabled persons, i.e. chair lift systems, grab bars; replacement of heating, ventilation and air conditioning systems as well as general site improvements such as interior and exterior painting, door replacement, and electrical and plumbing repairs.
- The My HOME Program provides homeownership assistance including down payment and closing costs, to purchase a residential property anywhere in Prince George's County.
- The Department of Environmental Resources continues to identify distressed multifamily properties and aggressively use code enforcement authority to inspect and cite those properties whose living conditions are not decent, safe, and sanitary.

Overcome gaps institutional structure and enhance coordination.

The Prince George's County Department of Housing and Community Development (DHCD) is the lead agency in initiating the update process of the *Consolidated Plan*. DHCD coordinates with key program staff from various county and state agencies responsible for planning housing, homelessness, economic development, revitalization, community infrastructure, and public service activities within the County. This

collaboration includes the collection of current data and information highlighting the successes in meeting the needs, goals, and objectives identified in the *Consolidated Plan*. Lead agencies consulted or used as sources during FY 2015 data collection include:

- DHCD, Community Planning and Development Division (CPD)
- DHCD, Housing Assistance Division (HAD)
- DHCD, Rental Assistance Division (RAD)
- Department of Social Services (DSS)
- Redevelopment Authority (RA)
- District of Columbia Department of Health, HIV/AIDS, Hepatitis, STD, and TB Administration (HASTA)

Improving Public Housing and Resident Initiatives

The Housing Assistance Division (HAD) manages the inventory of public and assisted housing and surplus properties owned by the Housing Authority of Prince George’s County (HAPGC). The majority, 296 units, of the 376 units of conventional public housing, is reserved for the elderly and disabled, with 80 units for families with children. The properties are located in Hyattsville, Cottage City, Laurel, Oxon Hill and District Heights, Maryland. The public housing program is funded by the United States Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) and operated through an agreement with the HAPGC. Eligibility is restricted to persons whose income is below 50% of the area’s median income, with rent calculated at 30% of the adjusted gross income. Residents are selected for admission from a community-wise waiting list based on preferences and date and time of application. The Division also manages a 16-unit townhouse complex of assisted housing located in District Heights, for families under the Partnership Rental Housing Program funded by the Maryland Department of Housing and Community Development (MDDHCD).

There are currently 1,960 applicants on the public housing waiting list as identified by bedroom size below:

In FY 2015, five public and assisted housing properties underwent renovations to improve resident satisfaction, increase market appeal, and address security, safety, and code requirements and improve energy efficiency. Modernization activities included the replacement and upgrade of electrical systems and services as well as aesthetic improvements. Accomplishments are illustrated in the following table.

Progress in Meeting Mission and Goals

The Authority completed comprehensive modernization at two high-rises for the elderly and selected improvements at other sites in the inventory. Renovations were done to address security, safety and code requirements, improve energy efficiency; increase resident satisfaction and market curb appeal.

Safety: To protect the lives and well-being of residents and employees, and reduce exposure to liability that results in financial losses, the Housing Authority gives priority to risk control management in all phases of program operations. The Authority participates in the Housing Authority Insurance (HAI) Risk Management Control Program.

Under HAI nine core risk control standards have been developed that must be met in order to qualify for the program. HAI also conducts annual assessments/inspections to ensure compliance. The Housing Authority has participated in this program since 2000 and continues to benefit from a ten to fifteen percent reduction in insurance premiums cost annually as well as cash rebates.

Crime Prevention: To improve crime prevention efforts at public and assisted housing properties, the Housing Authority continues its partnership with the Police Department to sponsor crime awareness programs especially at sites for the elderly. The program emphasizes prevention and reduction of crimes at the properties.

Police: Sworn uniformed law enforcement officers (sheriff's deputies, police officers or U. S. Marshalls) with marked vehicles live on site at 1100 Owens Rd, Cottage City Towers, Marlborough Towne, and Kimberly Gardens Communities. They maintain high visibility to increase safety and security and discourage crime and loitering. They have been effective in keeping crime away from the properties. During the reporting period there were no incidents of serious crimes committed against persons or property at any of the sites under management.

The Community Service Program at Marlborough Towne and Kimberly Gardens provides incentive for unemployed residents to look for employment or enroll in job training programs. Residents between the ages of 19 and 61 who are not working or engaged in an approved self-sufficiency program must perform eight hours of community service per month.

Resident Services

The Resident Services program provides supportive services to at-risk elderly and disabled residents. The program services 4 public housing properties for the elderly – Rollingcrest Village, Marlborough Towne, Cottage City Towers, and 1100 Owens Road where the program is also headquartered. Emphasis is on providing a comprehensive approach to service delivery that reduces premature institutionalization by promoting resident independence. Program components include case management and

congregate services to address personal care issues, wellness and health awareness and prevention education. Program efforts are focused on linking residents to the services they require that already exists in the community.

Program components include:

- Nutrition site that serves hot lunches 2 days a week for a nominal donation. This feeding site is based out of the 1100 Owens Road property. The commercial kitchen is licensed by the County's Health Department requiring certified food handling training for staff and volunteers.
- A 15 passenger, wheelchair accessible van to transport residents to congregate/community activities.
- Computer centers at 3 senior buildings: where classes are taught and coordinated by residents and community agencies.
- A calendar of congregate activities that promote resident's independence and increases the level of social interaction. Activities include tri-monthly visits by podiatrist, bingo, art and crafts, bi-monthly visits by Library-on-Wheels, and shopping trips to the mall, Farmer's Market and Wal-Mart.

Resident participation efforts consist of each public housing property having a Resident Council that meets monthly to plan resident activities, provide information about resident activities, and to advocate on behalf of their respective tenant population. There is a Resident Advisory Board (representation from each of the Resident Councils), that provides input into the Housing Authority's Annual Five Year Agency Plan. This plan is a HUD required document that identifies goals and objectives of the various housing programs for the coming years. In addition to comments by the general public, this plan requires that residents be given an opportunity to offer input and have their priorities for services and policies considered and incorporated when possible, into the plan.

Resident Initiatives: The Housing Authority operates Family Resource Academies at Kimberly Gardens and Marlborough Town to help children succeed in school and improve their opportunities for upward mobility.

Family Resource Academies (FRAs)

The Authority operates learning centers at the 2 family public housing properties located at Kimberly Gardens and Marlborough Towne. These technology centers are open to resident children, ages 6 – 18, and classroom-modeled lessons are taught, using information technology to improve skills in reading, mathematics and other disciplines. This program provides a wide range of opportunities to increase student's ability to exceed in school and meet educational requirements for higher learning. The Kimberly Gardens campus is enhanced by a partnership with a non-profit group who operates a homework club. The group has certified public school teachers who provide hands-on assistance for homework, special classroom projects, and ongoing tutorial assistance. Additionally, students of the County's Public School system are encouraged to use Community Services hours received through the FRA toward Community Services credits required for high school graduation. The Director of program has a doctorate in

education technology and the instructor is a certified public school teacher and is fluent in Spanish and teaches the language to children at the Marlborough Towne campus.

Reducing Lead-based Paint Hazards

The County Health Department performed lead testing only on children that are 6 years of age and under that are reported to have lead poisoning by their physician. The Health Department also follows through on referrals from the State of Maryland for children that rare reported to lead poisoning. Once the Health Department receives the referral they will perform blood testing, lead paint identification, and abatement and housing rehabilitation. Outreach and campaigns are extensive.

New Lead Based Paint Requirements for the Homeowner Rehabilitation Programs

The new HUD regulations described in 24 CFR Part 35, Subpart J—Rehabilitation require that lead hazard evaluation and reduction activities be carried out for all projects constructed before 1978 that are receiving rehabilitation assistance. Effective April 22, 2010, the federal law required contractors that perform renovation, repair, and painting projects in homes, child care facilities, and schools built before 1978 that disturb lead-based paint to be certified and follow specific work practices to prevent lead contamination.

Reducing the Number of Persons Living below the Poverty Level

According to the U.S. Census Bureau, a family or household of unrelated individuals with a total income that falls below the relevant poverty threshold is classified as being “below poverty level.” In 2008, the percentage of County families and individuals whose income was below the poverty level was 4.1 percent and 6.5 percent, respectively.

Low- to Moderate-Income Concentration

The Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) is required by law to set income limits that determine the eligibility of applicants for HUD’s assisted housing programs. HUD’s standard that is typically used to judge income types in the County is based on a percentage of area median income (AMI) established by HUD using the base median family income (MFI) for Prince George’s County. These standards or income limits are as follows:

Prince George's County uses the "uncapped" income limits to determine applicant eligibility to participate in the County's homeowner rehabilitation and homebuyer assistance programs administered with CDBG and/or HOME funds.

HUD qualifies individuals and families making less than 80 percent of the AMI as extremely low, very low-, low to moderate-income. Areas are considered to have a high concentration when more than 50 percent of the populations make less than 80 percent of the AMI.

In May 2010, the County developed a new Antipoverty Strategy which is incorporated in the approved *2011-2015 Consolidated Plan*. The following describes the actions the County will take to address the persons living below the poverty level for the next five years.

Creating Equitable Communities

According to HUD's FY 2009 Low and Moderate-income Estimates the following concentrated low and moderate-income eligible places were identified.

The County's Antipoverty vision is to redevelop the 16 concentrated low and moderate income eligible places (targeted areas) using holistic equitable revitalization strategies. One means to accomplish this is to make use of HUD's National Objective Slum and Blight (Area and Spot) for CDBG funded activities in these areas. HUD regulation require an "area must be officially delineated by the local government and must meet a definition of slum, blighted, deteriorated or deteriorating area under State of Local law

(24 CFR 570.483(c)(2)).

In 2009 and 2010 the County Council and County Executive approved enhanced land use planning documents developed under the stewardship of the Maryland - National Capital Park and Planning Commission which includes several of the 16 concentrated low and moderate income eligible places. These documents will serve as the basis for a long range comprehensive policy which will shape the physical development of the County's Antipoverty Strategy. The enhanced land use planning documents can be found at www.mncpp.org/pgco.

Each long range plan contains recommendations for land use, environmental, transportation systems, housing, public facilities, parks, open space, and urban design. The plans will be reviewed by a team consisting of staff from the Maryland - National Capital Park and Planning Commission, the Neighborhood Design Center, the Department of Housing and Community Development, the County Council, and the Office of the County Executive to map out official CDBG slum and blight designated areas for inclusion into the planning process for the 2011-2015 funded activities.

Equitable Revitalization: Policy Outcomes to Measure Success

Equitable community revitalization is identified in the field of community development as innovated strategies which aims are to preserve or obtain equity in the outcomes. Such actions are seen as preserving affordable housing, preventing mass neighborhood displacement, new construction that is inclusive adding one's existing low income persons in the economic mix, creating neighborhoods or communities that are socially and physically enhanced, promoting economic integration, and small, minority, women, etc participating in the wealth creation opportunities of the local/region economy.

Some notable equitable impacts the County will seek in 2011-2015 are:

1. Job development, training and placement programs for existing residents
2. Development of small, minority, women, business opportunities via startup capital, and other financial incentive programs which are to create local enterprises
3. Adhering to federal employment opportunities created by law such as HUD's Section 3 which is to be applicable to CDBG, HOME, ESG, HOPWA, NSP, Housing Authority Capital funds, and funding made available through the \$700 billion dollar American Recovery and Reinvestment Act activities (ARRA)
4. Building healthy and sustainable green housing markets
5. Creating neighborhood stability that addresses housing and commercial abandonment, foreclosure, property disinvestment,
6. Creating neighborhood quality of life by addressing transportation, retail, open spaces, schools, etc.
7. Enhancing wellness of the residents through healthy foods and opportunities
8. Enhancing home businesses/occupations in approved dwelling units allowed in the Prince George's County Zoning Ordinances

9. Supporting the community development approach “Place Matters” which addresses building movements for healthy communities by addressing regeneration and investments in environmental policies affecting land-use options, lack of health foods options in communities, the lack of clean, safe, open space such as parks and playgrounds, and producing safe, tolerant, and inclusive communities (www.policylink.com)
 10. Encouragement of and leveraging of philanthropy and capitalism for the achievement of social and economic community transformation strategies (philanthrocapitalism) by corporate foundations

Coordination with the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services (HHS)

The *2011-2015 Consolidated Plan* will be used as supportive policy guide and encouragement for non-profits, faith based organizations, County agencies, and others to more aggressively seek resources from the US Department of Health and Human Services (HHS) to further support the County’s Antipoverty strategic focus. HHS has four broad policy objectives under its Human Services programs which are synergistic to our County Antipoverty Strategy. They are:

1. Promote the economic independence and social well being of individuals and families across the lifespan
2. Protect the safety of children and youth and foster their well being
3. Encourage the development of strong, healthy, and supportive communities
4. Address the needs, strengths, and abilities of vulnerable populations.

HHS resources are to create healthy and productive individuals, families, and communities. HHS accomplishes its mission through more than 300 programs and initiatives that cover areas such as comprehensive health care, promoting healthy lifestyles, promoting healthy dietary practices, good nutrition, and regular physical activity, providing Head Start, offering services for older American, and supporting community action agencies (CAAs), just to name a few examples.

2011- 2015 CDBG funds will be used to support neighborhood and community based nonprofits leveraging HHS funding. Current stakeholder providers which have been instrumental to the County’s efforts to leverage funds have been:

- A. **United Communities Against Poverty (UCAP):** This is the only HHS approved community action agency in Prince George’s County which can administer HHS’s Community Services Block Grant (CSBG) program funds (www.hhs.gov).

The County supports the United Communities Against Poverty, Inc. (UCAP) Anti-Poverty Strategy. UCAP is a mission driven nonprofit advocating for communities that are disproportionately affected by poverty, inadequate health access, educational imbalances, homelessness, and unemployment. UCAP believes that in order to positively sustain community, specifically Prince

George's County residents, that dedication to recovery and reinvestment is vital. UCAP is devoted to doing just that.

UCAP's mission is to alleviate poverty; improve awareness of the needs of low and moderate income residents; and maximize the quality of life for residents through advocacy, quality services and resources. UCAP services include: Emergency Shelter (Shepherd's Cove) for women and children with on-site childcare, after-school and summer camp programming; senior activities; emergency food; The Progressive Path Program which provides permanent supportive housing for the disabled and chronically homeless; housing counseling, financial assistance with rent/mortgage/utilities, computer training, GED instruction, employment placement and readiness workshops, case management and substance abuse counseling, Educational Services, Financial Literacy Workshops, First-time Homebuyers Program (FTHB), Housing Counseling Program, Seniors Services, and Green Industry Certification Program.

National Objectives

As the Community Action Agency for Prince George's County, Maryland, UCAP strives to meet the following six national objectives:

- Low-Income People Become More Self-Sufficient;
- Conditions in Which Low-Income People Live Are Improved;
- Low-Income People Own a Stake In Their Community;
- Partnerships Among Supporters and Providers of Services of Low-Income People Are Achieved;
- Agencies Increase Their Capacity to Achieve Results; and
- Low-Income People, Especially Those Vulnerable Populations, Achieve Their Potential by Strengthening Family and Other Supportive Systems.

Program & Services

UCAP has 4 main divisions which include the following.

The Emergency Shelter Division: a 100 bed facility which served approximately 600 women and children in FY 2009. Residents stay in the facility up to 90 days, but the shelter staff can grant extended stays in special circumstances. All residents are assigned a case manager to assist with meeting service goals. An Employment Specialist Case Manager devotes 50% of his/her time working with residents to secure employment. Mothers with children are provided with free child care at the Shepherd's Cove Day Care Center, which is on the premises. Two major benefits of this program component are that it allows the children to be in a safe supervised environment while the parents are using their time to accomplish goals which include: 1) seeking employment, 2) securing some level of income, and 3) obtaining transitional and/or permanent housing. In addition,

school age children receive free tutoring in all subjects in the After School Program. UCAP also offers a free six week Summer Camp Program for children in the shelter and children living in transitional housing in the county. The women and children receive three nutritious meals a day, health services, mental health referrals, substance abuse counseling, educational workshops and recreational activities that are scheduled weekly to assist in preparation of transitioning to transitional housing, permanent supportive housing, independent housing or reunification with family.

The Supportive Permanent Housing Program-Progressive Path: is a comprehensive supportive program designed to help disabled individuals and/or formerly homeless families secure and remain in permanent housing. Twenty-two (22) apartment units are available to address the housing needs of this special population. Case managers work with residents to link them to resources that help participants attain appropriate mental health counseling services, medical services and drug or alcohol services. Case management efforts are centered on helping residents sustain economic independence, to promote self-sufficiency and remain in permanent housing. The objective is to empower our residents to stabilize their lives.

The Housing and Emergency Assistance Program: served over 1,300 individuals this past fiscal year. UCAP is a HUD approved Housing Counseling Agency. The agency received nearly 2,700 calls and screened nearly 50% of the individuals. These services help to prevent homelessness by providing emergency financial assistance for rent, mortgage and utility assistance. Other services include: financial literacy; credit and budget counseling; reverse mortgage, and food pantry services to provide nutritional bag meals for families and individuals. This program also has a First Time Homebuyers Program that makes it possible for low-income individuals and families to become homeowners.

The GED/Adult Basic Education, Employment Services and Computer Training Programs: provide training to consumers who are interested in getting their GED and getting basic training, intermediate or advance training in Microsoft Applications, and assist consumers in securing employment. Most of the students in the GED Program are young individuals who recently dropped out of high school. UCAP provides testing and tutoring services to assist students in passing the TABE test and the state's official General Equivalency Examination. Two graduation ceremonies are held each year to recognize the achievements of the students. The GED Program served 125 students last year. Approximately 70 students completed the 15 week core curriculum for GED testing. UCAP also works with local colleges to secure scholarships for their graduates.

UCAP partners with Federal, State and local county government entities to help sustain operations both programmatically and financially. The agency established collaborative relationships with area churches (nearly 60 congregations), schools, sororities and fraternities to support their work with funding, volunteer

support and in-kind goods. Through the support from various foundations, UCAP has worked to expand and extend services to meet the growing demands of the low-income, those in poverty and the homeless of Prince George's County.

- B. Human Services Coalition (HSC) of Prince George's County:** Started in 2000, as an advocacy and training organization, HSC is involved in building nonprofit capacity for direct service provision and creating systemic changes to low and moderate communities. HSC works closely with their partners' organizations to support new ideas that offer well planned, purposeful and data driven paths to achieve clearly defined goals for improving the health, social, and economic futures of residents of the sixteen CDBG target areas.

HSC has been provided for the last two years some of the County's CDBG planning/administrative dollars to administer a CDBG funded Nonprofit Incubator Program for non-profit capacity building. Twenty five organizations have been annually selected to participate in the Incubator program and half of them are given an opportunity to participate in a HSC financial assistance activity. HSC is also a 2009 winner of a HHS Compassion Capitol Fund award to carry out community enhancing activities. HSC is also teaching non-profits how to change their affective communities through the understanding and use of **Community Benefit Agreements (CBAs)**. CBAs are legally enforceable agreements between a set of community groups and a developer, in which the developer agrees to specific outcomes defined by the affected/impacted community in order to obtain public support for the developer's plans (www.hscofpgc.org)

- C. Consumer Health Foundation (CHF):** is a national health organization which goal is to achieve health justice in historically underserved communities. Community Health is about ensuring equal access to quality health care in socially and economically challenged communities. CHF work is about challenging structural racism and inequities in employment, housing, education, and health care, that promotes poor health outcomes among all people of color especially very low to low/moderate incomes (www.consumerhealthfdn.org)
- D. Community Health Centers:** During times of challenges community health centers provide an important safety net to many in poverty and others whom may be of low to moderate income. In Prince George's County the community health center making inroads in the fight on poverty is the Renaissance Treatment Center (www.rmgrtc.org). The County has utilized CDBG funds to supplement the center's services to many of the residents from the 16 CDBG targeted tracts with the highest concentrations of low and moderate income persons.

Community Based Service Organizations

Annually funds are appropriated from the CDBG program to community based direct service organizations. Below are some representative sample organizations which missions are aligned to address county wide and target area poverty:

- A. **Mission of Love, Charities, Inc:** Mission of Love Charities (MOLC) is a multifaceted health and human services organization dedicated to helping the underserved and misfortunate by providing free programs and services designed to meet immediate and short term needs of poverty and low income residents. MOLC accomplishes their efforts through four (4) core programs which are the basic needs, life skills, youth development, and a senior network (www.molinc.org)

- B. **The ARC of Prince George's County, Inc:** The ARC provides an extensive array of services to children and adults with developmental disabilities including residential services, family and individual support services, community support living arrangements, daytime services to those who are medically frail, job training, employment supports and advocacy with schools (www.thearcofpgc.org)

- C. **CASA de Maryland:** is a Latino and immigration advocacy and assistance organization based in Maryland, with a major focus in Prince George's County. CASA operates day labor centers, offer health assistance, medical interpretation, English classes, financial literacy classes, vocation training, social services, and leadership development (www.casademaryland.org).

- D. **Neighborhood Design Center:** is a non-profit service provider of architectural design and related services for initiating the necessary series required to engage in community and housing development activities.

Most poverty-level households are located in older established communities. Expanding economic opportunities for low- and moderate-income persons and producing and preserving quality affordable housing are a means to reducing the number of persons living below the poverty level in Prince George's County.

Supporting the County's *Continuum of Care* goal of ending chronic and non-chronic homelessness is also a means in reducing the number of persons living below the poverty level. The Continuum of Care system includes a prevention strategy for persons who are at risk of becoming homeless. These strategic efforts are described in the Strategic Plan section of the *Consolidated Plan*. They outline the goals, objectives and performance measures set forth to ensure the County is addressing the housing and community development priority needs.

CDBG funds were also given to a number of non-profit organizations to provide low-income residents with services to improve health, safety, and quality of life. Assistance included employment training, housing counseling, services for the elderly and frail elderly, public housing services, health care, transportation services, homeless services, services for persons with disabilities, and services for children and youth.

In addition, the Department of Social Services (DSS) administered Welfare to Work, known in Maryland as the Family Investment Program. The Program's mission is to increase the productivity of all applicants and recipients of public assisted services by emphasizing the expectation of employment while preserving the dignity and self-esteem of all customers. DSS works with other public and private entities to accomplish this mission.

F. Leveraging and Matching Requirements

Leveraging Resources

In FY 2015 the County used CDBG, HOME, and ESG funds to obtain other public and private resources that addressed housing and community development needs in the Annual Action Plan.

CDBG Program: The Department of Housing and Community Development uses a formal application or request-for-application process to partner with non-profit organizations, municipalities, and local government agencies. The CDBG program operates on a reimbursement basis. The prospective applicant will often times use CDBG funds as leverage when seeking other funding sources in an effort to successfully carry out their activity. During FY 2015 CDBG funds were leveraged dollar-for-dollar.

HOME Program: The Department of Housing and Community Development generally use HOME funds as gap financing to successfully carry out the various HOME projects. The form of financial assistance is determined on a project-by-project basis, throughout the fiscal year and provided according the HOME Limits.

ESG Program: The Department of Social Services distributes ESG funds through a competitive process that begins with a Request for Proposals (RFPs). DSS must use ESG funds to leverage other public and private funds necessary to adequately provide essential supportive services to the County's homeless population. During FY 2015 ESG funds were used to leverage local funds.

Matching Requirements

CDBG Program: HUD does not require matching contributions in the CDBG program.

HOME Program: Under the National Affordable Housing Act, which authorized the HOME program, matching contributions are required as the State and local government stake in the HOME program. The match is the local, non-Federal, permanent contribution to affordable housing, and is not counted to leveraging requirements. The HOME program requires the County to provide a match of not less than 25 percent of the HOME funds drawn down for project costs. During FY 2015, the County incurred a HOME Match liability of \$28,021.73. The County's excess match is carried over and used to meet Match liability for subsequent year.

ESG Program: Under the Stewart B. McKinney Homeless Assistance Act of 1988, matching contributions are required as the State and local government stake in the ESG program. The ESG program requires the County to provide a match of not less than 100 percent of the ESG funds.

Program Income

CDBG Program: CDBG program income earned by the Housing Rehabilitation Assistance Program (HRAP) is committed to the HRAP Revolving Loan funds and the HRAP Administration fund. Funds generated from CDBG the Commercial Multi Family Loan program (Housing Preservation) is generally committed to other eligible CDBG activities.

HOME Program: Program income generated by HOME activities must be disbursed before any new entitlement funds are used. The HOME Program Income are used for the new reconstruction or rehabilitation of affordable and/or workforce housing opportunities. In addition 10 percent of all program income is deposited in the HOME account during the program year and is used for administrative and planning costs.

G. Citizen Comments

On September 10, 2014, the Draft FY 2015 CAPER became available to the public for review and comment for a period of 15 days. Copies of the draft CAPER were made available at the following locations: the Department of Housing and Community Development, 9200 Basil Court, Suite 500, Largo, Maryland, 20774 and on the County’s website at <http://www.princegeorgescountymd.gov/sites/DHCD/Resources/PlansAndReports/Pages/default.aspx> under the Department of Housing and Community Development, (DHCD). Copies were also available by mail upon request. No comments were received.

H. Self-Evaluation – Formula Programs

Community Development Block Grant (CDBG)

The County’s overall goal in FY 2015 was to stabilize and increase housing opportunities for 969 households; improve the safety and livability of

neighborhoods for principally 37,995 low and moderate-income individuals; create and/or retain 46 jobs and assist 177 small businesses.

The County exceeded its annual housing goal by assisting 1,370 households with the use of various federal, state, and local funds however, 2 percent of the annual accomplishment was met with CDBG funds.

For suitable living environments and economic opportunities, CDBG funds were the primary source of funding. The County created a suitable living environment for 18,216 individuals; forty-eight percent of its annual goal of 37,995.

For economic opportunities, 335 jobs were created and/or retained and 69 businesses were assisted. The County exceeded its annual goal by using CDBG funds to expand economic opportunities.

The Department of Housing and Community Development along with Prince George's County Representatives are continuing to support activities that address unmet needs in order that all goals are achieved by the end of the 5-year goal. Lack of funding remains to have a negative impact on fulfilling the overall vision; however, the Department continues to encourage non-profits to form partnerships with other non-profits that have similar visions in order that partnerships will have a positive impact on the County.

HOME Investment Partnerships (HOME)

In April 2014, through a competitive process, DHCD awarded a contract totaling \$2,542,595.78 to the Redevelopment Authority of Prince George's County in partnership with Housing Initiative Partnership, Inc. to administer the Housing Rehabilitation Assistance Program (HRAP) under the administrative oversight of DHCD.

Through the third party administrator, the County will continue to provide a resource to enable single-family, owner-occupied, homeowners to rehabilitate their residence to maintain safe, decent, and quality housing. The HRAP will continue to upgrade the stock of older homes and neighborhoods reviving them into safer, economically viable, and more desirable residential structures. HRAP funding is solely comprised of Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) funds.

In FY 2015, DHCD completed the rehabilitation of twenty-one (21) homes expending approximately \$1,067,666 in CDBG funds. There were no HOME funded homeowner rehabilitation activities completed during FY 2015. It is estimated that nineteen (19) rehabilitation activities will be completed during the next fiscal year.

The Redevelopment Authority of Prince George's County (RDA) used \$2,355,850.08 in HOME funds to provide homeownership assistance to one hundred ten (110) low and moderate income buyers to purchase residential

properties *anywhere* in Prince George's County, MD under the "My HOME" program

DHCD's Housing Development Division (HDD), administers a rental-housing programs that focuses on elderly and multi-family housing development and redevelopment throughout the County. HOME funds are used to develop and rehabilitate properties and to maintain affordability. During FY 2015, no projects were completed however five development projects are in the pipeline.

Emergency Solutions Grant (ESG)

The County operates a 24/7/365 hotline for calls related to homelessness and 5 emergency shelter projects serving youth, individuals and families that are literally homeless; 1. 100 bed shelter for single women and women with children (boys age 11 & under), 2. 24 bed shelter for single men, 3. 38 bed shelter for parents with children that include boys over age 11, childless couples, and intact families, 4. 10 beds for unaccompanied youth age 13-24, and 5. 50 bed hypothermia shelter for individuals and families. Each resident is provided with basic shelter amenities as well as employment, case management, health care, and housing placement assistance.

Homeless Hotline Outcomes:

All County emergency shelters are accessed through the Homeless Hotline, by calling a toll-free number 24/7 throughout the year. The central point of entry allows homeless persons to access shelter without having to navigate several shelter systems. Residents are screened, assessed and linked to either an appropriate emergency shelter based on gender, family composition, need, and bed availability or to the Shelter Diversion Counselor. The main goal of the Shelter Diversion program is to provide appropriate crisis intervention services aimed at preventing households experiencing temporary crisis from entering the shelter system. Services include rental assistance, credit counseling, job placement, and landlord/tenant mediation.

Proposed Outcome: 5,000 unique callers will be triaged through the hotline.

Outcome(s): 1. 4,586 unique callers were triaged through the hotline
2. 39,322 total calls for shelter were processed by the hotline.

Emergency Shelter Outcomes:

1. *Shepherd's Cove*: This is a shelter for single homeless women and women with children (boys up to 11 years of age only). The residents share space with other women and children in a dormitory-type setting. Each family member is provided with a bed or cot, clean linens, blankets, and other basic shelter amenities. The shelter provides 20 beds for single homeless women and 80 beds for women with children. All residents receive three meals a day, and are allowed to stay at the shelter for up to 90 days. While in the shelter, residents receive comprehensive

case management services, health care services, employment, and housing placement assistance.

2. *Prince George's House*: This is a combination emergency and transitional shelter for single homeless men 18 years or older. The residents share space with other men in a dormitory-type setting. The shelter has a total of 36 beds. Twenty-four beds are used for emergency shelter and 12 beds are used for transitional housing. All residents receive three meals a day. Those residing in the emergency beds are allowed to stay at the shelter for up to 90 days while those in the transitional beds may stay for up to 1 year.
3. *Family Emergency Shelter*: This is a shelter for homeless single parents with children and boys over 11 years of age, childless couples, and intact two parent families with minor children. The families are housed in fully furnished one and two bedroom apartment units at scattered sites in Oxon Hill, Maryland. The shelter has a total of 10 units and all units have kitchens that are equipped with cooking utensils to allow the resident to prepare their own meals. The residents are allowed to stay at the shelter for up to 90 days. They receive an array of supportive services including case management services, substance abuse screening and counseling and housing placement assistance.
4. *Promise Place Shelter*: This is an emergency shelter for homeless and unaccompanied youth and young adults between the ages of 13-24. The shelter provides 10 beds and residents share space in a dormitory-type setting. Each youth is provided with a bed, clean linens, blankets, and three meals a day and are allowed to stay at the shelter for up to 21 days. Youth receive an array of supportive services including case management services, family counseling, substance abuse screening and counseling, education and employment support and housing placement assistance. In addition, the County supports a second youth shelter program through a partnership with MMYC for an additional 4 beds in host homes throughout the County providing the same compliment of services.
5. *Hypothermia Program*: This program offers a 12-hour overnight daily shelter for homeless individuals and families during the winter months, from November through April. Over 30 community-based churches, volunteer and public and private organizations work with Community Crisis Services to implement the program. The program provides 50 overnight beds through scattered church sites in the County.

Proposed Outcome: 1,000 will benefit from the shelter programs.

Outcome 1: 838 individuals sheltered

Break-out by shelter: Cove-406, PG House-122, FES-119, Youth-45, and Hypothermia*-254

*note: Duplication may occur for customers served by the hypothermia program as some are eventually moved to the 24/7/365 shelters as space becomes available.

Outcome 2: 319 individuals were diverted from shelter

HOMELESS PREVENTION:

Supportive services are provided to persons at imminent risk of homelessness to help them maintain stable housing, including but not limited to outreach and engagement, case management, and follow-up. When needed, financial assistance is also provided to individuals and families at imminent risk of homelessness to preserve and maintain stable housing; including, but not limited to payment of rental arrearages and ongoing rental support.

Proposed Outcome: 25 households at risk of homelessness will benefit.

Outcome: 14 households (44 individuals) were served

RAPID RE-HOUSING

Supportive services are provided to homeless persons to help them obtain and maintain housing, including but not limited to outreach and engagement, case management, housing search and placement, and follow-up. When needed, financial assistance is also provided to help homeless individuals and families secure and maintain stable housing; including, but not limited to payment of security deposits and first month's rent.

Proposed Outcome: 25 homeless households will benefit.

Outcome: 11 households (39 individuals) were served

HMIS

The Department of Social Services is the County's HMIS Lead Agency and is responsible for hosting and maintaining all HMIS data, ensuring data quality, reporting, conducting training, providing technical support to all users, designing custom reports, and other HMIS data activities.

Housing Opportunities for Persons with AIDS (HOPWA)

At the end of the County's reporting period, 151 or eighty-eight percent of the 172 units projected for Tenant-based Rental Assistance and short-term rent, mortgage, and utility payments were actually supported with HOPWA funds for the purpose of providing assistance or residential support to persons with HIV/AIDS and their families; 140 were Rental Assistance units and 11 were for Short-term/Emergency Housing Payments.

The primary obstacle facing HOPWA participants in Suburban Maryland is the scarcity of affordable housing. The supply of affordable rental units is very limited. Declines in vacancy rates and increases in average rents create an affordability barrier for

residents. Individuals who do not receive rent subsidy have difficulty finding appropriate places to live. Apartments in the Suburban Maryland region are too expensive for many low-income residents. Renters in this region often incur housing cost burdens.

The Suburban Maryland program will continue to provide tenant-based rental *assistance to persons with HIV/AIDS and their families. It is projected that the need for services will continue to increase as the life span of persons living with HIV/AIDS continues to improve.* Housing providers have changed the priority from helping people at the end of their lives to assisting them transition to living with a chronic illness. Many Suburban Maryland persons with HIV/AIDS are living in family units. Every effort must be made to stabilize currently adequate living conditions to prevent homelessness and premature placement of dependent children into foster care.

The remaining gap in services is seeking additional funding through Federal, State and local resources.

I. Monitoring

DHCD is responsible for monitoring the CDBG, HOME, ESG, and HOPWA programs to ensure compliance with federal statutory and regulatory requirements for these programs. Monitoring is conducted in accordance to the Department's Policies and Procedures Manual.

CDBG: The Monitoring Team reviews each CDBG activity's past performances (i.e., two or more grant awards open and incomplete, no disbursements/draws for 12 months or more, etc.) using various sources such as: IDIS reports and consultations with project managers when determining the risk factors.

In FY 2015, the Department conducted twenty-nine (29) on-site monitoring visits during the program year. The purpose of the visits was to determine whether the sub-recipient implemented and administered CDBG-funded activities according to all applicable Federal and County requirements. Basic program requirements include financial administration, program progress, project activity and benefit reporting, procurement, labor standards, relocation, recordkeeping, fair housing, conflict of interest, labor standards and equal employment opportunity. Written assessments of the sub-recipients performance in implementing their CDBG projects are currently underway.

HOME and Projects Financed with Tax-exempt Bonds and HOME Funds: Prince George's County has approximately 10 tax-exempt bond financed multi-family rental housing projects, totaling 2,277 units. Qualified tenants certified by the CPD totals 618. Bond monitoring requires monthly and quarterly review of project records, leases, and income certification forms. Annual re-certification of qualified tenants is required. A Compliance Monitoring report is submitted annually to the Trustee for the bonds of each project. The report covers project operation, occupancy, management, and reporting. Prior to closing on a rehabilitation project that is being financed with tax-exempt bonds,

the project must be pre-qualified, certifying that the project has the required percentage of qualified tenants.

Continuing Disclosure to facilitate compliance with the requirements of Rule 15c2-12 of the Securities Exchange is required annually for certain issues of bonds that financed multi-family housing projects and single family mortgage revenue bonds. Financial statements and average occupancy reports for the projects are reviewed, and financial reports are prepared on the single family mortgage revenue bonds. These reports are then filed with Nationally Recognized Municipal Securities Information Repositories and the Trustee for each of the bond issues.

All projects assisted with HOME funds were monitored during this fiscal year. There are 37 HOME projects, consisting of 550 HOME units. When monitoring HOME projects, compliance with the following issues were determined: 1) monitor low-income occupancy requirements; 2) A written tenant selection procedure is reviewed; 3) review County issued multi-family license; 4) review rents and utility allowances; 5) calculate the maximum rent levels and tenant's incomes; 6) check tenant complaints if any. All projects assisted with HOME funds are also monitored to ensure compliance with Federal standards. This includes monitoring construction projects subject to Section 3, Davis-Bacon Wage Rates, Minority-and Women-owned Business Enterprises, Housing Quality Standards, Section 504/ADA, and other federal requirements.

CPD staff carries out Housing Quality Standards (HQS) inspections on all HOME assisted projects. During FY 2015, twenty-four (24) HOME rental units were monitored for HQS compliance. Inspection deficiencies were noted with corrective action and follow up inspections were performed within the appropriate timeframe.

ESG: Project Managers conduct biannual monitoring reviews for the emergency shelters and annually for the Homeless Hotline. Monthly progress reports are compared to data submitted to the Homeless Management Information System (HMIS) to ensure all information entered is accurate and consistent. As of this time all activities are progressing on schedule and grant disbursements are timely. In FY 2015 no ESG monitoring visits were conducted.

HOPWA: Monitoring for the Suburban Maryland program is conducted on two levels. The District Department of Health, HIV/AIDS, Hepatitis, STD and TB Administration (HASTA) performed the financial and programmatic monitoring of two (2) sub-recipients during FY 2015. Financial monitoring consists of reviewing requests for reimbursement from participating agencies. Programmatic monitoring involves data collection to review the progress of agencies toward meeting HOPWA annual objectives and to review the numbers and characteristics of beneficiaries served.

III. PROGRAM NARRATIVES

A. Community Development Block Grant Program

The Department of Housing and Community Development (DHCD) administers the County's CDBG program. The DHCD Community Planning and Development (CPD) Division is responsible for the oversight and management of the CDBG program. The primary grant administration functions are oversight, monitoring, compliance, and technical assistance.

The CDBG program provides annual grants on a formula basis to entitled cities and counties to develop viable urban communities by providing decent housing, a suitable living environment, and expanding economic opportunities for principally low and moderate-income persons.

B. HOME Investment Partnerships Program

The County exceeded its annual housing goal with the use of various federal, state, and local funds however, eight-percent of the annual accomplishment was met with HOME funds. In FY 2015, one hundred 110 (110) households were assisted with HOME funds.

HOME Activities Undertaken in FY 2015

Homeowner Rehabilitation Activities

In April 2014, through a competitive process, DHCD awarded a contract totaling \$2,542,595.78 to the Redevelopment Authority of Prince George's County in partnership with Housing Initiative Partnership, Inc. to administer the Housing Rehabilitation Assistance Program (HRAP) under the administrative oversight of DHCD.

Through the third party administrator, the County will continue to provide a resource to enable single-family, owner-occupied, homeowners to rehabilitate their residence to maintain safe, decent, and quality housing. The HRAP will continue to upgrade the stock of older homes and neighborhoods reviving them into safer, economically viable, and more desirable residential structures. HRAP funding is solely comprised of Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) funds.

In FY 2015, DHCD completed the rehabilitation of twenty-one (21) homes expending approximately \$1,067,666 in CDBG funds. There were no HOME funded homeowner rehabilitation activities completed during FY 2015. It is estimated that nineteen (19) rehabilitation activities will be completed during the next fiscal year.

Homebuyer Activities

The Homebuyer Activities program includes acquisition, acquisition and rehabilitation and new construction. HOME funds are used to assist low-income homebuyers and non-homeless populations with special needs.

My HOME Program

The ***My HOME*** Program provides homeownership assistance including down payment and closing costs, to purchase a residential property anywhere in Prince George's County. Income eligible, first time homebuyers can obtain a 0% interest, deferred payment loan for up to 5% of the purchase price, only as needed, after completion of a layering analysis incorporating all sources of funds for the transaction. The borrower must make a minimum contribution of the greater of 1.75% of the purchase price or 50% of liquid assets over \$3,000 the transaction.

Eligible borrowers must be credit worthy, must initially be approved for a first mortgage from an FHA approved lender, and must complete an 8 hour pre-purchase counseling class. The first mortgage cannot have an adjustable interest rate or balloon payment. The home purchased must be and remain the primary residency of the borrower for a minimum period of 10 years. Affordability of the property during the 10 year affordability period is preserved through a recapture provision enforced through a regulatory agreement and covenants recorded in the land records of Prince George's County.

In this fiscal year, one hundred ten (110) My HOME settlements were completed.

Beneficiaries: 110 at or below 80% of area median income.

Multi-Family Rental Housing Construction and Rehabilitation Program

DHCD's Housing Development Division (HDD), administers a rental-housing programs that focuses on elderly and multi-family housing development and redevelopment throughout the County. HOME funds are used for the acquisition, construction and

rehabilitation of affordable rental housing. Forms of financial assistance can include predevelopment loans and/or grants, construction loans, permanent mortgage loans, bridge loans, and credit enhancement. Existing debt can be refinanced under certain circumstances.

HOME funds are used to develop and rehabilitate properties and to maintain affordability. Each project includes information on whether the investment is being made to maintain current affordable units, create affordable units, or both. During FY 2015, no projects were completed however five development projects are in the pipeline:

- Residences at Woodland Springs,
- Conifer Village,
- Bladensburg Commons,
- Brinkley Hill Project and
- Rainier Manor Phase II.

CHDO Set-Aside Activities

One of two main purposes of The National Affordable Housing Act of 1990, (the Act that created the HOME program) is to expand the capacity of nonprofit community housing development organizations to develop and manage decent, safe, sanitary and affordable housing. HOME regulations found at 24 CFR Part 92.300(a) requires the County to reserve no less than 15% of HOME funds for investment in housing that will be owned, sponsored and/or developed by Community Housing Development Organizations (“CHDO”).

Eligible activities found at 24 CFR Part 92.300(a) include acquisition, rehabilitation and new construction of rental housing; acquisition, rehabilitation and new construction of homebuyer properties; and direct financial assistance (down payment and closing cost) to purchasers of HOME-assisted housing sponsored or developed by a CHDO. The County has the option of using up to 5% of its annual HOME entitlement allocation for reasonable and necessary costs to operate the CHDO as well as provide up to 10% of its HOME entitlement for predevelopment loans for technical assistance, site control and/or preconstruction costs such as feasibility studies, architecture and engineering fees, and consultants.

HDD evaluates CHDO projects based on the criteria described in the CHDO Project Evaluation and Underwriting Checklist found in the CHDO Toolbox for HOME PJ's. Criteria include the CHDO's development capacity and experience, demonstrated market need for the proposed project as well as borrower and project risk factors. HDD considers the project feasible if the CHDO has capacity and experience in developing similar projects, there is a market demand for the product supported by a market study and the proposed project is consistent with the Consolidated Plan and Annual Action Plan goals and objectives.

In order to receive CHDO set aside funds, applicants must be certified CHDOs. In FY 2015, the County certified one CHDO, Housing Initiative Partnership, Inc. (“HIP”). In FY 2015, the project listed below was eligible to receive CHDO set aside funds.

- Housing Initiative Partnership, Inc.
HIP had an Operating Agreement with the County in the amount of \$900,000 to administer the HIP Homes Program for the purpose of providing affordable housing and homeownership opportunities to low and moderate-income households. The Agreements expired 6/30/2014. The program assisted in the acquisition, rehabilitation and/or development of eleven (11) single-family properties to be sold to an income eligible purchaser. In addition, HIP also uses CHDO Operating funds to assist with the organization’s administrative costs.

The National Affordable Housing Act of 1990 also requires Participating Jurisdictions (PJ) such as Prince George’s County, MD to make reasonable efforts to identify community housing development organizations that are capable of or can reasonably expect to become capable of carrying out elements of the jurisdiction’s housing strategy. HOME is a key resource in building capacity of these organizations.

The County has identified the following groups as potential CHDO’s;

- Casa de Maryland, Inc.
- AHC – Prince George’s County, Inc.

In today’s federal funding environment and the current homeownership market, potential CHDO’s will need to be able to create effective partnerships that will leverage multiple funding sources in addition to HOME funds. New CHDO’s must understand their role in carrying out the jurisdiction’s housing strategy, the local housing market and design homebuyer programs that address the community’s needs.

Tenant-based Rental Assistance Program

During the fiscal year, the County did not administer a Tenant-based Rental Assistance (TBRA) program.

HOME Match and Performance Report

HOME Program: Under the National Affordable Housing Act, which authorized the HOME program, matching contributions are required as the State and local government stake in the HOME program. The match is the local, non-Federal, permanent contribution to affordable housing, and is not counted to leveraging requirements. The HOME program requires the County to provide a match of not less than 25 percent of the HOME funds drawn down for project costs. During FY 2015, the County incurred a HOME Match liability of \$28,021.73. The County’s excess match is carried over and used to meet Match liability for subsequent years.

Affirmative Marketing Actions

All development projects applying for HOME funds are required to submit to the department a copy of their marketing plan. Their plan is reviewed by staff to ensure attention to affirmative and fair housing marketing. Guidance to staff and developers is provided by the department's Fair Housing specialist.

When projects are completed and are in the monitoring phase, DHCD staff as part of the overall monitoring function during the affordability period reviews the project's affirmative and fair housing compliance. That includes among other things a review of the project's affirmative and fair housing marketing efforts and materials; written tenant selection procedures; tenant leases, tenant rents and utility allowances; low-income occupancy; etc., and tenant complaints, if any. DHCD staff provides training to the project management staff, if necessary; to ensure affirmative marketing and fair housing compliance procedures are followed.

Minority Outreach

Prince George's County ensures good faith efforts towards the inclusion of minorities and women in all contracts entered into by the County in order to facilitate affordable housing activities. Contracts and subcontracts with minority-and women-owned businesses can cover various types of projects such as: purchases, consulting services, construction, and economic development.

C. Emergency Solutions Grant Program

Assessment of Relationship of ESG funds to Goals and Objectives

During FY 2015, ESG funds were used to address the priority needs, goals and objectives described in the County's 2011-2015 Consolidated Plan; making incremental progress towards the County's long-term goal of ending chronic and non-chronic homelessness. While the Department of Housing and Community Development is the administering agency, the Department of Social Services (DSS) is responsible for the oversight and management of the ESG program. DSS - through contracts with private non-profit agencies in the County - uses ESG funds to provide emergency shelter assistance to those who already homeless in the community and to provide appropriate intervention services aimed at preventing individuals and households experiencing temporary crisis from entering the shelter system. Services include rental assistance, landlord / tenant mediation and critical linkages to transitional housing, permanent supportive housing and / or other appropriate housing options whenever possible.

The following chart summarizes the County's progress in meeting that progress by objective:

Implementation of Comprehensive Homeless Planning Strategy

DSS provides the oversight and management of ESG funds in Prince George's County. The funds are designated to provide prevention and diversion services, to operate emergency shelters within the first tier of the Continuum of Care, and to provide homeless prevention and rapid re-housing assistance to households that are experiencing temporary housing crisis in the community. Structured services begin with a call to the central point of intake. Callers are assessed by case staff and provided with homeless prevention, diversion and relocation services wherever possible. When this is not successful, based on bed availability and individual caller circumstances, referrals are made through HMIS to the appropriate County shelter. While in shelter, customers receive a variety of supportive services geared towards rapidly moving people from homelessness into housing. Funds are also used to link homeless individuals and families to other tiers of the Continuum such as transitional housing, permanent supportive housing and other appropriate housing alternatives when all other lower level interventions have been unsuccessful. This grant is critical to continued operation of emergency shelters within the Continuum. Emergency shelters are where customers are stabilized, individual services plans are developed and linkages to a myriad of resources are made. The following chart identifies the number and types of individuals served during FY 2015:

Matching Resources:

In FY 2015, DSS projected a budget of \$2,137,278 to adequately provide essential supportive services to the County's homeless population. Federal, state, and local funds were designated for administration, shelter, homeless prevention, rapid re-housing and HMIS services. The County was entitled to receive \$363,115 in ESG funds, representing 17% of the total budgeted amount. These funds were 100% matched as required by HUD with County General Funds and State Emergency and Transitional Housing Services funds.

D. Housing Opportunities for Persons with AIDS

Assessment of Relationship of HOPWA funds to Goals and Objectives

During FY 2015, HOPWA funds were used to address the following priority needs, goals and special objectives described in the County's 2011-2015 Consolidated Plan.

Decent Housing

In FY 2015, the goal was to assist in the provision of housing options for 172 persons living with HIV/AIDS. The County met eighty-eight percent of its annual goal.

The District of Columbia Department of Health, HIV/AIDS, Hepatitis, STD, and TB Administration (HAHSTA) is the agency responsible for the fiscal and programmatic

administration and oversight of sub-recipients for Suburban Maryland. This region includes Prince George's County, Calvert County, and Charles County. HAHSTA has contracted with Greater Washington Urban League, Inc. and Suburban Maryland Tri-County Community Action Committee, Inc. to administer the HOPWA program. HOPWA provides Tenant-based Rental Assistance (TBRA) to households with family member(s) affected by the virus. It also provides emergency short-term assistance to eligible applicants with HIV/AIDS.

Suburban Maryland jurisdictions operate HOPWA programs in collaboration with nonprofit organizations including local health departments to obtain services through Ryan White who help clients secure and sustain their housing. Continuum of care remains a priority for case managers as needed to ensure housing stability plans are in place and adhere to, while providing clients with a variety of supportive services.

Notable increase in the amount of clients with gainful employment, as a result clients have become self-sufficient no longer needing rental assistance. Favorable results from our client satisfaction survey regarding program's overall performance to improve our quality service.

All rental units in Suburban Maryland are available to individuals with HIV/AIDS as long as the rents are reasonable as defined by the HUD Fair Market Rents (FMRs) and as required by federal HOPWA regulations. There are several types of housing units available for rent in Suburban Maryland including garden-style and high-rise apartments, single-family homes, condos and townhomes.

In FY 2015, Suburban Maryland received HOPWA funds to provide 172 housing units. Major goals and activities described in the FY 2015 Annual Action Plan are as follows:

- Provide tenant-based rental assistance for 142 households living with HIV/AIDS.
- Provide housing related short-term assistance to 30 households living with HIV/AIDS.
- A thorough document checklist audit was conducted on entire caseload to ensure accuracy which resulted in achieving an exceptional audit conducted by our program funders.
- Provide supportive services to clients in obtaining affordable housing and referrals for job training and employment to promote self-sufficiency.
- Prepare and submit monthly programmatic reports and rent rolls on time to ensure timely expenditure of HOPWA funds.

During FY 2015, HOPWA funds were used for the purpose of providing assistance or residential support to persons with HIV/AIDS and their families; 140 were Rental Assistance units and 11 were for Short-term/Emergency Housing Payments. (See Performance Charts on next page)

Overview of Barriers

- Hard to house some clients due to poor credit history.
- Lack of funding to assist clients with high security deposits.
- The increasing amount of landlords requiring clients to pay for all utility in their units.
- Increasing client's voucher size due to adult family members and their children
- High rents and rent increases over FMR's.
- Long stagnate waiting list with no increase in funding to issue new housing vouchers.

Improvements Needed to Overcome Barriers

- Offer free credit classes/workshops including pulling credit reports and credit counseling.
- Provide funding in budget for housing placement to provide security deposits.
- Encourage clients to locate units with all or some utilities included in rent.
- Set an age limit for adult children in the household to move out.
- HUD's FMR's need to be conducive to current market rents.
- Close housing waiting list or provide more funding or reframe from cutting budget in order to help those on the list.

The HOPWA, short-term rent, mortgage, and utility assistance is available to qualifying clients who are on the waiting list for long-term rental assistance. Other applicants may also apply.

The Suburban Maryland program will continue to provide tenant-based rental assistance to persons with HIV/AIDS and their families. While the need for services will continue to increase as the life span of persons living with HIV/AIDS continues to improve with healthy lifestyles and medication. The face of the TBRA program is changing because of this trend and we continue to see increasing incomes.

Institutional Structure and Coordination

The HOPWA program is coordinated and promoted through each local Continuum of Care network, which serves homeless people. Each jurisdiction refers clients who already receive rental subsidy but may need services from their HOPWA operating agency.

Local agencies administering the Temporary Assistance for Needy Families Program (TANF) and the local child welfare agencies responsible for the care of minors facing out-of-home placements also provide referrals to HOPWA agencies.

The Health Department in each Suburban Maryland jurisdiction and other HIV agencies promotes the prevention of HIV/AIDS through strategies such as increasing awareness and providing effective instruction about HIV/AIDS.

A network of government and private, nonprofit agencies in Suburban Maryland provide services to individuals with HIV/AIDS. Each HOPWA agency collaborates with these entities creating a continuum of care for clients. The Ryan White Care Act, Titles I and II, provides services to residents. All such Ryan White services are available to persons served by HOPWA funds. These services allow clients to live independently in their own homes. Service providers offer family and individual counseling, transportation assistance, food donations, and housekeeping support to eligible clients. A growing number of nursing homes are increasingly providing skilled care for persons living with HIV/AIDS. Hospice and home-based hospice care are other essential links in the institutional system.

Community-based organizations such as the Family Services Foundation, Prince George's County Department of Health, Prince George's County Department of Social Services, Prince George's County Department of Corrections, the Regional Veterans Services, and other local providers receive information on the HOPWA program goals and achievements. Through the distribution of the Suburban Maryland HOPWA "Program Summary", these community organizations are invited to consult on current and future program operations. This process of citizen participation and consultation established the priorities for the HOPWA program.

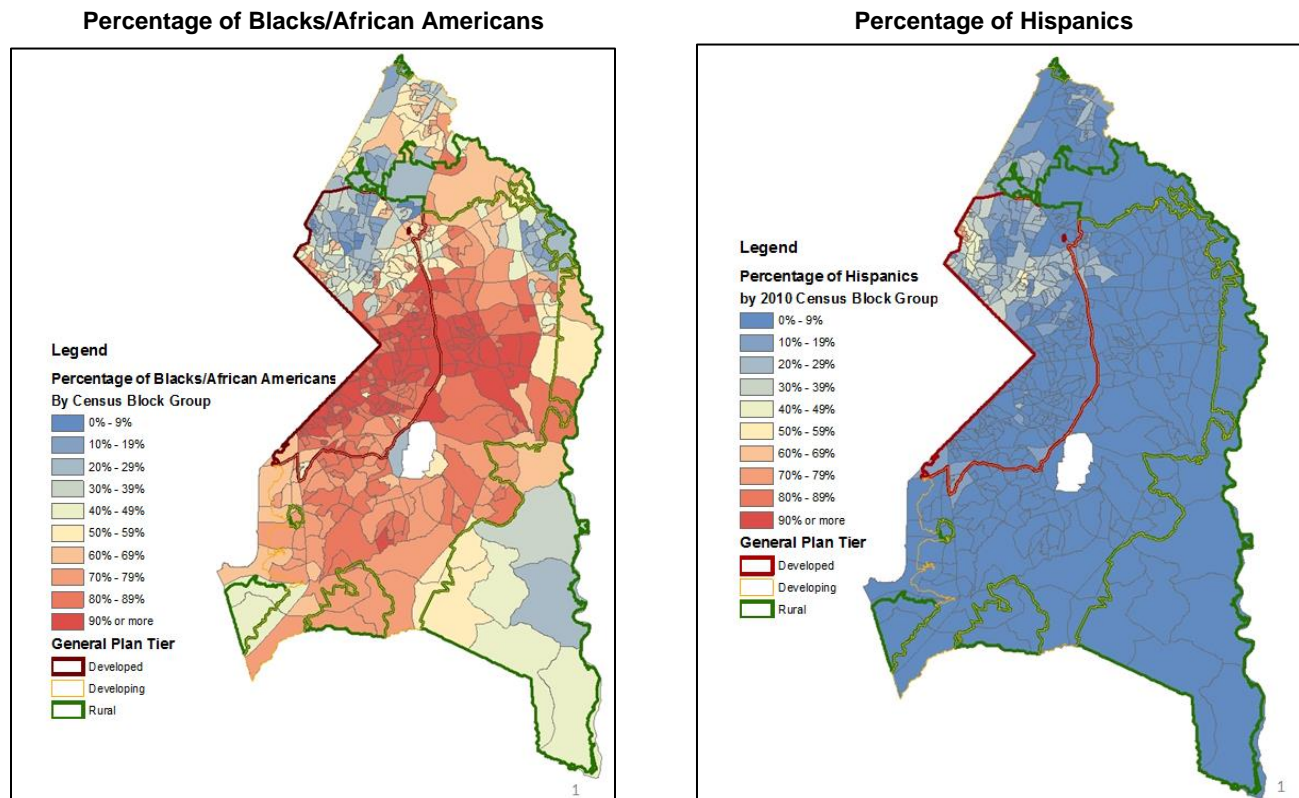
E. Geographic Distribution of Federal Funds

Rationale for Geographic Distributions for Investments

Minority Concentration

The 2012 Analysis to Impediments of Fair Housing Choice defines an area of racial or ethnic minority concentration as census tracts with more than double the Washington, D.C. regional proportion of each minority group. In 2010, Black/African-American residents comprised 64% of all residents in the County, thus areas of concentration include census tracts with more than 52% of the region's Black/African-American residents. All but 30 of the County's 151 census tracts are areas of concentration of Black/African-American residents. In 2010, Hispanic residents comprised 14.9% of all residents. Concentrations of Hispanics would include census tracts where the percentage of Hispanics is above 26% of the regional rate. These areas included 14 census tracts in the County. It is important to note that areas of high ethnic and minority concentration also align with low income concentrated areas of the County (primarily Inner Beltway communities).

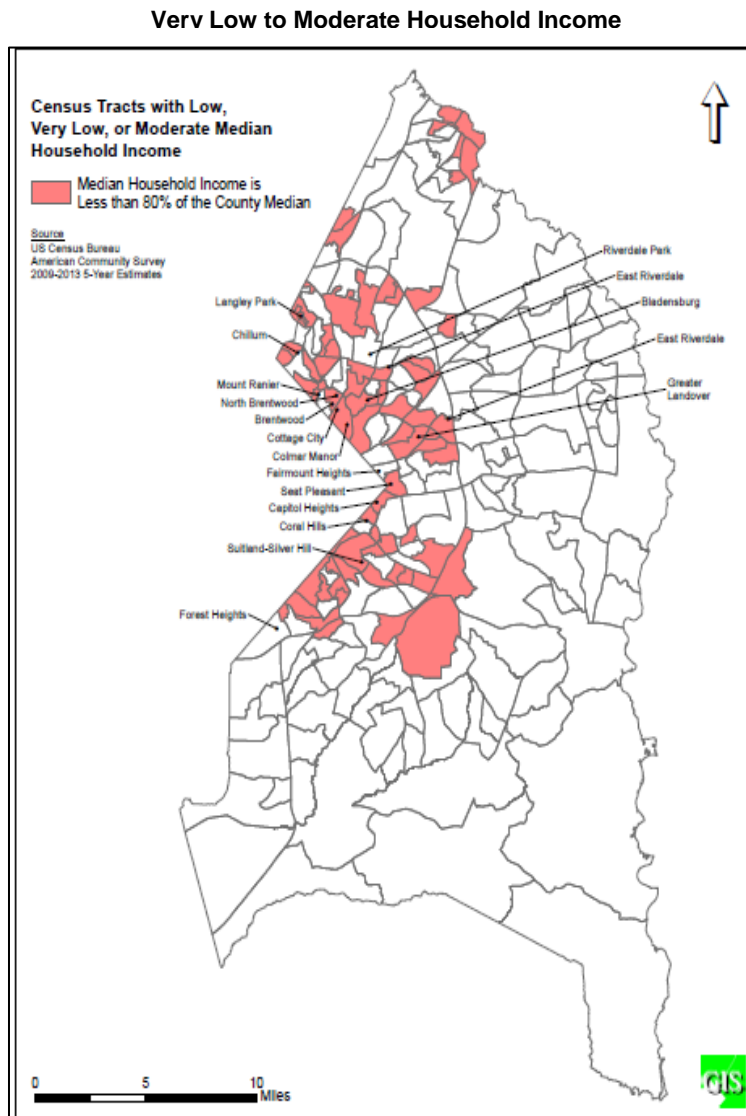
The maps below show the areas of racial and ethnic minority concentration:



Low- to Moderate-Income Concentration

HUD qualifies individuals and families making less than 80 percent of the AMI as very low-, low-, or moderate-income. Areas are considered to have a high concentration of very low-, low-, or moderate-income persons when more than 50 percent of the populations make less than 80 percent of the AMI.

The following map illustrates census tract areas in the County with a high concentration of very low, low- to moderate-income individuals.



In Fiscal Year 2015, the County's Federally-funded programs (CDBG and HOME) primarily focused on revitalizing the minority and low and moderate-income concentrated areas with these funds by promoting activities such as: homeownership and rehabilitation of existing housing, strengthening the economic base, improving infrastructure and public facilities, and providing public services that improve the health, welfare and safety of low-income residents. The ESG and HOPWA funds were also used community-wide to provide housing and supportive services for the homeless and non-homeless persons with special needs.
