

WHAT IS INVOLVED IN ALCOHOL AND DRUG ABUSE TREATMENT?

ADOLESCENT SERVICES

Counselors provide specialized services to Prince George’s County adolescents ages 12 to 18 at Prince George’s County Health Department Behavioral Health Centers.

- **Drug, alcohol, and other substance abuse information:** Learn about the effects of alcohol and drug abuse on the user and the family.
- **Drug use assessment and evaluation:** An evaluation is made to determine what services are needed for the individual.
- **Individual, group, and family counseling:** Appointments are available to talk with competent, caring counselors with extensive experience working with adults, teens, and families.
- **Crisis intervention:** Assistance is provided to help solve an immediate crisis situation, along with encouragement and referrals to the necessary type of care.

ADULT SERVICES

Specialized services are available at this location for adult County residents age 18 years and older.

- **Counseling services for adults with serious alcohol and other substance abuse problems:** Program participants attend individual and group counseling and skill-building sessions over several weeks. Those who have completed treatment can receive ongoing support to aid in their sustained recovery.
- **DUI/DWI (Driving Under the Influence/Driving While Intoxicated) services:** Clients who have received a drinking while driving charge can complete either a 12-week Group Education or 26-week counseling program (determined by legal circumstances) to keep driving privileges. The fees will be identified at the time of assessment.
- **Compulsive gambling and stop-smoking programs:** All Prince George’s County residents age 18 and older are eligible for gambling counseling, smoking cessation, and/or free nicotine patches. Anti-smoking community education programs are also available.
- **Referrals to other services:** When more help is needed, we assist the client in connecting to other community health resources.
- **Prevention services for school groups, neighborhood groups, faith-based groups, and work places.**

HOW DO I KNOW WHEN THERE IS A DRINKING OR DRUG PROBLEM?

Answering the following four questions can help you find out if you or a loved one has a drinking problem.

- Have you ever felt that you should cut down on your drinking or drug use?
- Have people annoyed you by criticizing your drinking or drug use?
- Have you ever felt bad or guilty about your drinking or drug use?
- Have you ever had a drink or taken drugs first thing in the morning to steady your nerves or to get rid of a hangover?

One “yes” answer suggests a possible alcohol or drug problem. More than one “yes” means it is likely that a problem exists.

If you think that you or someone you know might have a drinking or drug problem, it is important to see a doctor or other health care provider right away.

WHAT IS ALCOHOL ABUSE?

If drinking alcohol interferes with your health or daily living, it is considered to be problem drinking.

Symptoms of alcohol or other drug abuse include:

- Personality changes
- Blackouts: Not being able to remember things that are said and done when drinking
- Tolerance-drinking, smoking, or using drugs more and more for the same "high"
- Denial of a problem
- Gulping or sneaking drinks or hits
- Using alcohol or drugs alone or early in the morning
- Experiencing changes in academic performance, work performance, increased absenteeism, and loss of interest in sports or other favorite activities

WHAT IS DRUG ABUSE?

Drug abuse can occur with use of illegal drugs such as marijuana, cocaine, heroin, or other "street drugs," as well as misuse of prescribed medication.

Symptoms of drug abuse include:

- Tolerance: Needing increasingly larger amounts of drugs to get high
- Craving drugs or alcohol
- Loss of control: Trying to cut down on the use of drugs or stop using without success
- Experiencing changes in academic performance, work performance, increased absenteeism, and loss of interest in sports or other favorite activities
