The regular meeting of the Nuisance Abatement Board of Prince George's County Government was called to order at 9:30AM EST on June 26, 2025, virtually via Zoom by Shirley Lathern, Chair.

#### I. APPROVAL

The agenda for the meeting was distributed and unanimously approved. The minutes of the previous meeting were reviewed and unanimously approved.

#### II. CONSIDERATION OF OPEN ISSUES

Case No. NAB-00010-2025: 5709 Ellerbie Street, Lanham, MD 20706

Violation of Subtitle 14, Division 14, Section 14-172, which prohibits the operation of a public or neighborhood nuisance.

Case No. NAB-00014-2025: 3614 Bonhoeffer Drive, Bowie, MD 20721

Violation of Subtitle 14, Division 14, Section 14-172, which prohibits the operation of a public or neighborhood nuisance.

CASE No. NAB-00015-2025: 10305 Haliard Street, Cheltenham, MD 20623

Violation of Subtitle 14, Division 14, Section 14-172, which prohibits the operation of a public or neighborhood nuisance.

### III. DECISIONS

Each case is deliberated in closed session. The Board unanimously voted to declare case NAB-00010-2025 a public and neighborhood nuisance, ordered all nuisance activities to cease and desist, and imposed a \$1,000 fine. The Board also unanimously declared case NAB-00014-2025 a public and neighborhood nuisance, ordered all nuisance activities to cease and desist, and imposed a \$1,000 fine. The Board unanimously voted to deny the Petition, and no abatement order was issued for case NAB-00015-2025. The Board did not feel the evidence presented met the required standard under the Code, therefore no abatement order or penalties were issued. The meeting was adjourned at 1:30 pm by Shirley Lathern, Chair.
