This meeting was conducted virtually. Ms. Tignor called the meeting to order at 5:30 p.m., and a quorum was present. Shafiq Satterfield also participated virtually. Ms. Tignor asked that Ms. Deegan chair the meeting. There were no guests.

MINUTES

Ms. Deegan noted that on Page 2, Parody should read Parity. A motion was made by Mr. Gorman, seconded by Ms. Lundy, and duly passed accepting the minutes for the February 2, 2026, regular meeting with the correction noted.

ADMINISTRATOR'S REPORT

Correspondence – None.

Ms. Claire Frank-Seisay joined the meeting as a guest.

Gubernatorial Primary Election –

- Precinct Locations – Staff identified mistakes in the list sent to the State Board of Elections (SBE) for approval. The number of physical locations changed from 238 to 223 because of combined precincts.
- Early Voting Sites and Drop Box Locations – Some of the location changes are temporary and some are permanent. SBE approved our lists and the Board of Elections (BOE) will send letters to affected voters.

Election Judges – Effective February 2026, BOE began sharing hiring information for our Election Judges. BOE is still working on the report format; it is a working document with daily changes and updates as election judge training progresses. MD Voters includes information for Democratic and Republican affiliated judges, and an additional report was identified to include unaffiliated judges.

Election judge training is scheduled into May 2026. Training for Early Voting Site judges will include a mock polling place unit (like the training used for the last Special Election).

Voter Registrations – The Maryland Voter Registration System is updated based on information received from the registrants, ERIC (Electronic Registration Information Center), MVA (Motor Vehicle Administration, NCOA (National Change of Address), and other reports. Ms. Honesty-Bey will email this report to the Board. This report is available on the BOE website.

2026 Maryland Legislative Session – The following bills/resolutions were noted:

- HB1069/SB0949 – Requiring the State Administrator of Elections to establish a uniform tabulation policy for absentee ballots with federal contests only if there is an occurrence of federal judicial action regarding the timely receipt of certain absentee ballots that preempts a certain State law and regulation; and requiring the State Administrator to provide certain additional notice to voters regarding absentee ballots under certain circumstances using certain methods.
- HB0496 – Authorizing a voter unaffiliated with a political party to vote the ballot for unaffiliated voters or the ballot of the political party of the voter's choice in a primary election; and prohibiting a voter unaffiliated with a political party who votes the ballot of a political party in a primary election from automatically becoming affiliated with the political party whose ballot the voter voted.

PERSONNEL

- Seasonal Positions – Hiring started in December 2025 to support the Gubernatorial Elections.
- Citizen Services Assistant – Susan Kreutter retired the end of February 2026. Staff is preparing the paperwork for approval to advertise and hire.

OLD BUSINESS – Ms. Deegan asked if the inactive voter list was purged at the end of December 2025. Ms. Honesty-Bey responded that a letter was sent to SBE previously, and she will provide an update.

NEW BUSINESS –

- BOE received an inquiry about the petition process for a candidate to be on the General Election ballot.
- Ms. Lundy asked about the rules for supporting a candidate. Mr. Horne referred them to the approved By-Laws.

LEGAL – Mr. Horne reported that there was nothing new to report.

NEXT MEETING – The next regular meeting is scheduled for Monday, April 5, 2026, at 5:30 p.m., and it will be held in-person at the BOE Office.

A motion was made by Ms. Howell, seconded by Ms. Scott, and duly passed to close the meeting at 6:05 p.m.
