This meeting was conducted virtually. Ms. Tignor called the meeting to order at 5:30 p.m., and a quorum was present. Shafiq Satterfield and Brian Brown also participated virtually.

### **MINUTES**

A motion was made by Ms. Lundy, seconded by Ms. Howell, and duly passed accepting the minutes for the January 5, 2026, regular meeting.

### **ADMINISTRATOR'S REPORT**

Correspondence – January 14, 2026, letter from Jolie McShane to the Open Meetings Compliance Board regarding the posting of meeting minutes, and the January 15, 2026, response from Ms. Honesty-Bey to the Open Meetings Compliance Board. The minutes are posted after approval by the Board. The timeliness of posting some prior months minutes were questioned and steps were taken to ensure that the delays would be corrected. Ms. Honesty-Bey noted that the minutes are posted to the State Board of Elections (SBE) website.

### Gubernatorial Primary Election –

- Drop Boxes, Early Voting Sites, Precinct Locations – The SBE approved the lists submitted by the Board of Elections (BOE). The lists will be posted to the BOE website, and voters affected by precinct location changes will be notified.
- Election Judge Training Manual – SBE approved our manual. It is QR coded and will be linked on the BOE website. Election Judge training starts February 9, 2026.
- February 24, 2026 – final date to file for candidacy.
- Staff is modifying the processes for pre- and post-election day canvassing.

Election Judge Parody Report – SBE implemented the Election Judge Parody Report. Beginning February 2026, BOE will share hiring information for our Election Judges. The report is approximately 133 pages and includes information for Democratic and Republican affiliated judges. It does not include unaffiliated judges.

Risk Limiting Audit (RLA) – SBE implemented a revised process for conducting the RLA. This was a manual audit in prior elections. BOE is participating with the SBE work group to understand the requirements of the law. The work group will continue meetings with the SBE to develop test procedures and conduct a mock audit. BOE is gathering information based on email guidelines.

Voter Registrations – The Maryland Voter Registration System is updated based on information received from the registrants, ERIC (Electronic Registration Information Center), MVA (Motor Vehicle Administration, NCOA (National Change of Address), and other reports. Ms. Honesty-Bey will email this report to the Board. This report is available on the BOE website.

**PERSONNEL**

- Seasonal Positions – hiring started in December to support the Gubernatorial Elections
- IT Manager – Ms. Honesty-Bey introduced Brian Brown.

**OLD BUSINESS** – None

**NEW BUSINESS** – Ms. Hutchinson reported on a statewide contest to promote high school student voter registrations. Senior students can register at 16 years old and vote in the General Election if they turn 18 by Election Day. The contest deadline was extended to February 27, 2026. Ms. Hutchinson advised that all public and private schools would be notified that the extension. Schools reaching the 90% goal will receive the “Key” award. In addition, Sororities, Fraternities, and the League of Women Voters also assist with voter registration.

**LEGAL** – Mr. Horne reported that a decision regarding the redistricting challenge has not been received. The SBE is monitoring the redistricting situation closely. He noted that the decision to conduct today’s meeting virtually was due to weather conditions. If someone reported to the BOE office, he/she would be able to join the meeting virtually.

**NEXT MEETING** – The next regular meeting is scheduled for Monday, March 2, 2026, at 5:30 p.m., and it will be held in-person at the BOE Office.
