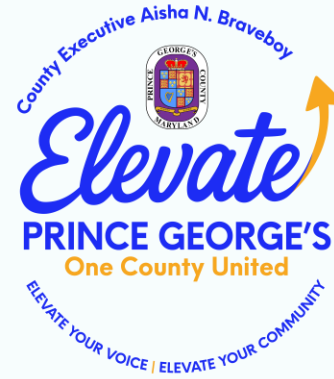

DWP&T is responsible for **County-maintained roadways** that range from rural to urban classifications. The **transportation infrastructure** includes 900 bridges, 3,000 acres of grassy area, as well as shoulders, sidewalks, curbs/gutters, stormwater management facilities.

Removing **snow and ice** from County-maintained roadways, upgrading traffic signals, installing streetlights, clearing fallen trees, unclogging drainage inlets and maintaining **stormwater management facilities**, performing roadway repairs ranging from potholes and sidewalk trip hazards to bridge repairs and resurfacing projects, as well as operating **Transit** services.

# Residential Street Sweeping

Residential Street Sweeping will resume on Monday,  
April 13, 2026

The Residential Street Sweeping Program aims to significantly reduce the amount of debris along residential roadways, helping to prevent litter buildup and mitigate potential pollutants in our ecosystem. The Street Sweeping Program pilot launched in September 2024. Phase II, Countywide street sweeping began in April 2025.

- Street sweeping is not a litter or leaf collection service.
- Please check the schedule and remove vehicles from the road on your scheduled sweeping day.

# Office of the Director - Vision Zero

**Vision Zero in Prince George's County is a countywide initiative aimed at eliminating traffic deaths and serious injuries by 2040 through safer road design, education, enforcement, and community engagement.**



The program made substantial progress on the **Road to Zero Plan 2026–2030** through research, surveys, and a formal gap analysis, collecting **2,000+ resident responses** to inform plan development.



The program also completed **Near-miss Safety Study** with Kimley Horn, funded by **\$40,000 MWCOG** grant, providing key insights to guide the new plan and advancing the County's leadership in proactive and predictive safety strategies.



Community engagement and education expanded through **40+ pop-up events**, distribution of **7000+ safety items** and other safety programs.



The program also deployed a **StreetSmart VR campaign** supported by the \$31,000 MHSO General Safety grant, **engaging over 900 participants – 96% reported increased awareness of pedestrians and bicyclists.**



The program secured **\$231,000 award** to establish a **Safe Routes to School Coordinator** position, which will expand capacity beginning in FY2027.

- Contractors operate on a bi-weekly schedule in all 9 council districts.
- County Rights-of-Way (3ft from roadway edge) are the areas of responsibility.
- Adopt-a-Road; OHM has relaunched its program and registration information is available.
- Abutters Ordinance: Home and land-owners are responsible for cleaning debris, leaves and small trash on their property.

- **The Milestone:** 4,184+ Potholes Repaired Since March 9.
- **The Workflow:**
  - **1. Report:** Use the PGC311 App or Web Portal.
  - **2. Repair:** County crews are dispatched for rapid resolution.
  - **3. Restore:** Safer commutes for every Prince George's County resident.

# Contracted Tree Trimming

The Tree Team is doing amazing work reducing 311 numbers and addressing storm events!

Tree trimming is accomplished by service request and/or inspections and issued to contracted vendors for scheduling and completion. Tree and stump removals are provided when the tree is found to be dead or when dead tree limbs fall to the ground because of inclement weather and stormy conditions.

OHM continues to develop strategic processes and explore new contracts to address tree 311 requests.

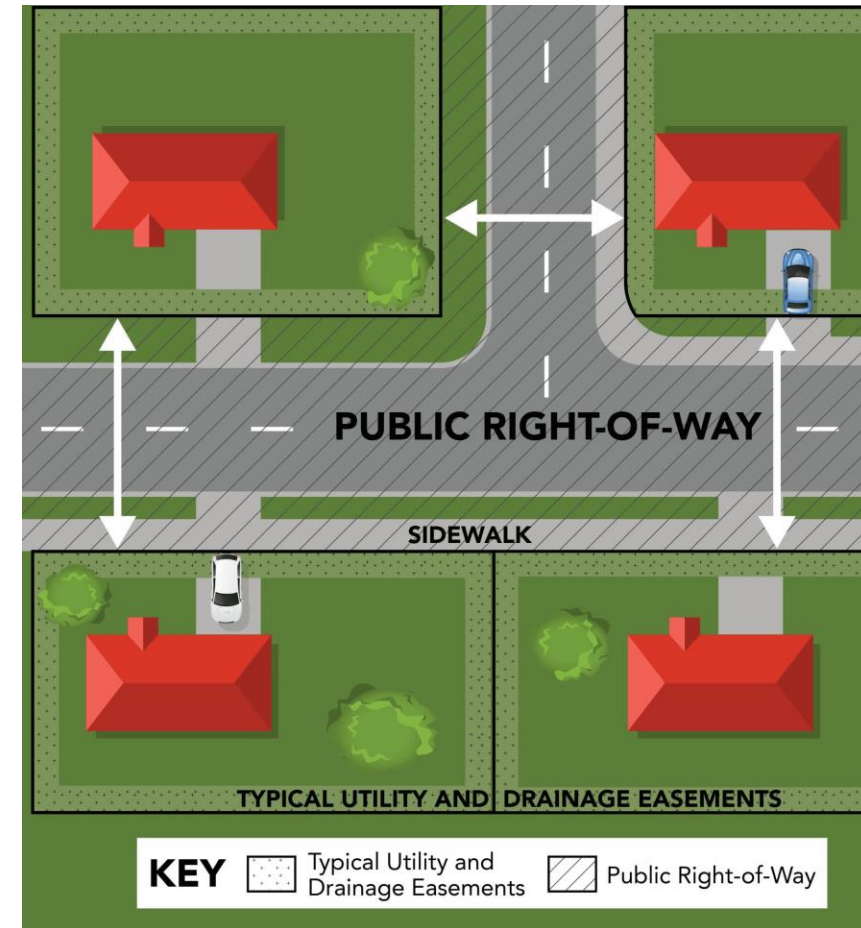

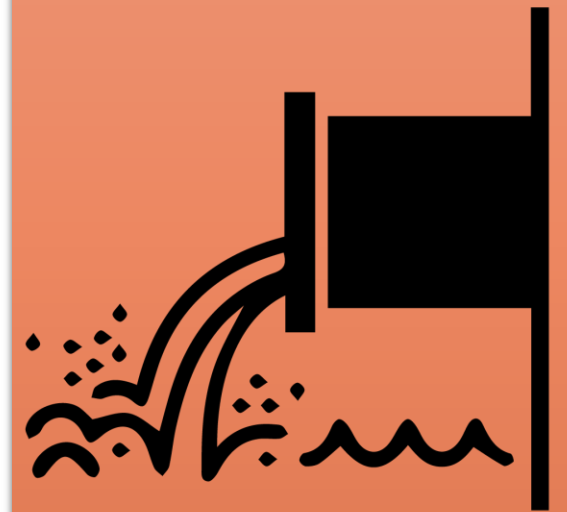

# What is the NTMP?

**The Neighborhood Traffic Management Program (NTMP) was initiated by DPW&T in 1996 to promote and encourage the safety and livability of Prince George's County's residential roads.**

The NTMP provides a process for identifying, evaluating, and addressing undesirable traffic conditions related to speeding and excessive cut through traffic volumes.

# What is the NTMP?

- **Request made on behalf of a community by the HOA or Council Member.**
- **Traffic Data collection (road classification, speed, volumes, sidewalks, trip generation, etc.)**
  - **72 consecutive** hours of speed and volume data collection
  - **6-9 months from the initial date of request to complete the overall study/outcome** that includes crash data evaluation and geometric conditions.
- Traffic Study and output of analysis based on NTMP Point System
- Identify appropriate measures
- Feedback and community approval
