



Strategic and Operational Priorities

Strategic Priorities

- Reduce flood risks by identifying hazard areas, implementing mitigation measures, and expanding early warning systems
- Improve County water quality by retrofitting impervious areas with stormwater controls and meeting NPDES/MS4 permit requirements
- Expand landfill life by constructing Area C, upgrading the scale house, improving access roads, and expanding residential food scrap composting
- Expand litter receptacles and surveillance cameras to deter illegal dumping
- Increase green infrastructure in equity areas and farmland to reduce stormwater impacts, mitigate heat, sequester carbon, and enhance community aesthetics
- Increase animal placements through community outreach and integrating animal control into emergency services


Guidance and Best Practices to Help Vendors Prepare Effectively

- Provide clear, complete, and well-structured solicitation documents
- Offer realistic timeline
- Host pre-bid or pre-proposal meetings
- Provide a transparent Q&A process
- Give vendors advance notice of compliance requirements
- Properly notify all bidders the outcome of procurement
- Offer debrief sessions




