CHARGES:

The Prince George's County Animal Services Division, PGASD, is requesting a Dangerous dog hearing for the above listed animal. On March 26, 2026, LACO Deppner #905 responded to the above address to Initiate 'In Home' 10-day Quarantine, following a 'new' dog bite, reported to the County Health Dept. on March 22, 2026. While at the address, the suspect dog was let loose from the home and tried to attack the responding Officer. An elderly woman refused to securely contain the dog so that he could investigate the reported dog bite. The dog continued to charge at the ACO vehicle. Eventually an unidentified woman, possibly Ms. Popelle, arrived at the house. She denied any dog bite, entered the house with the dog, and refused to come outside to discuss further. PGASD sent a confinement letter on April 2, 2025, then responded to the address (5) additional times within the last 12 months for Confinement complaints, with 2-3 dog(s) reported to be running loose and on school grounds next door chasing people in an aggressive manner. There is an additional reported dog bite on Feb. 20, 2026, involving the dog 'El Chapo' and another human victim. This is in violation of Section 3-131 (c) 'Manner of Keeping; Prohibition of Nuisances'; Section 3-132 'Public Nuisance Conditions'; Section 3-135 'Animals at large prohibited'; Section 3-136, 'Dangerous Animals'; Section 3-142 'Irresponsible Pet Owner'; Section 3-145 'Ferret, dog, and cat licenses'; Section 3-182 'Potentially Dangerous Animals'; and Section 3-186 'Vaccination of dogs, cats, and ferrets'.

CHARGES:

The Prince George's County Animal Services Division, PGASD, is requesting an Animal Control Commission hearing regarding the above listed animal impounded from 8106 Temple Hill Rd Clinton, MD 20735. Allegedly on April 11, 2026, Prince Georges County Animal Services received a call from police Officer B. Golway #3939 stating a Belgian Malinois and other breed dogs were being housed in filthy conditions. Due to the conditions of the animals within the home PGASD removed all animals for their health and safety. This is in violation of Section 3-131 (a) (1) 'Manner of Keeping; Proper Food; (a) (2) 'Manner of Keeping; Proper Water; (a) (3) 'Manner of Keeping; Proper Shelter; (a) (4) 'Manner of Keeping; Proper Space'; (a) (5) 'Manner of Keeping; Proper Exercise'; (6) 'Manner of Keeping; Proper Care'; (7) 'Manner of Keeping; Proper Veterinary Care'; (8) 'Manner of Keeping; Proper Grooming'; (11) 'Manner of Keeping; Proper Air'; (12) 'Manner of Keeping; Proper Cleaning'; Section 1-133 'Sanitary conditions for care and maintenance of animals'; Section 3-142 'Irresponsible Pet Owner'; Section 3-145 'License required for dogs, cats and ferrets'; Section 3-180 'Animal Cruelty and Neglect; prohibited'; and 3-186 'Rabies vaccination of dogs, cats, and ferrets'.

CHARGES:

The Prince George's County Animal Services Division is requesting a Dangerous dog hearing for the above listed animal. Allegedly, on May 12, 2026, Mr. Jones' dog "Bear" was being walked off-leash and noticed Ms. Burnham's dog 'Benny' a mixed Beagle type dog, being walked on a leash in common area between houses. He ran up to and grabbed 'Benny' on the rear and began attacking him. 'Benny's intestines were exposed, and he was rushed to an emergency veterinary hospital for treatment. 'Benny' was later euthanized at the veterinary hospital due to extreme nature of his injuries. Both pet owners have been bitten by 'Benny' while trying to get help. This is in violation of Section 3-131, 'Manner of Keeping; Prohibition of Nuisances'; Section 3-132 'Public Nuisance Conditions'; Section 3-135 'Animals at large prohibited'; Section 3-136 'Dangerous Animals'; Section 3-142 'Irresponsible Pet Owner'; Section 3-145 'Ferret, dog, and cat licenses'; Section 3-182 'Potentially Dangerous Animals'.

CHARGES:

The City of Greenbelt Animal Services is requesting a dangerous dog hearing for the above-listed animal. Allegedly on May 19, 2026, Mr. McNair's and Ms. Holden's dog "Queen" was reportedly running at large and ran across a parking

lot and attacked Mr. and Mrs. Sampson's dog. The attack has resulted in the death of Mr. and Mrs. Sampson's dog. Witness, Ms. Gonzalez, was allegedly bitten by "Queen" in the process of trying to stop the attack. This is in violation of Section 3-131 (c) 'Manner of Keeping; Prohibition of Nuisances'; Section 3-132 'Public Nuisance Conditions'; Section 3-135 'Animals at Large Prohibited'; Section 3-136 'Dangerous Animals'; Section 3-142 "irresponsible Pet Owner"; Section 3-145 'Ferret, dog, and cat licenses'; Section 3-182 'Potentially Dangerous Animals'; and Section 3-186 'Vaccination of dogs, cats and ferrets'.

CHARGES:

Allegedly, Mr. Viera's black-and-brindle Cane Corso-type dog, named "Woody," along with another unidentified dog belonging to Mr. Viera, has been observed running at large and trespassing onto Ms. Onyia's property during operating hours of her childcare business, Evangel Christian Child Care Center. This is in violation of Section 3-131, Manner of Keeping; Prohibition of Nuisances'; Section 3-132 'Public Nuisance Conditions'; Section 3-135 'Animals at large prohibited'; Section 3-142 'Irresponsible Pet Owner'; and Section 3-182 'Potentially Dangerous Animals'.

CHARGES:

Allegedly, Ms. Bryant's female, large, black and white dog had attacked Ms. Floyd last year. Since the attack, Ms. Floyd has witnessed Bryant's dog running at large in the neighborhood. This is in violation of Section 3-131, 'Manner of Keeping; Prohibition of Nuisances'; Section 3-132 'Public Nuisance Conditions'; Section 3-135 'Animals at large prohibited'; Section 3-136 'Dangerous Animals'; Section 3-142 'Irresponsible Pet Owner'; Section 3-145 'Ferret, dog, and cat licenses'; Section 3-182 'Potentially Dangerous Animals'.
