CHARGES:

The Prince George's County Animal Services Division is requesting an Animal Control Commission hearing regarding the above listed animal(s) impounded from 15302 Marlboro Pike Upper Marlboro, MD 20772. Allegedly on January 15, 2026, Prince Georges County Animal Services received a call from a citizen for a small brown pit bull terrier tied up in the front yard. Upon arrival the responding ACO found one small brown pit bull terrier on a short tether attached to the front door. The dog was impounded for its health and safety. This is in violation of Section 3-131 (a) (1) 'Manner of Keeping; Proper Food; (a) (2) 'Manner of Keeping; Proper Water; (a) (3) 'Manner of Keeping; Proper Shelter; (a) (4) 'Manner of Keeping; Proper Space'; Section 3-142 'Irresponsible Pet Owner'; Section 3-145 'License required for dogs, cats and ferrets'; Section 3-180 'Animal Cruelty and Neglect; prohibited'; Section 3-181 'Unlawful restraint of dogs' and 3-186 'Rabies vaccination of dogs, cats, and ferrets'.

CHARGES:

The Prince George's County Animal Services Division is requesting an Animal Control Commission hearing regarding the above listed animal(s) impounded from 6901 Mumford St. Allegedly on January 14th, 2026, The Prince Georges County Animal Services Division received a complaint from a citizen advising three dogs were left in a trailer and fighting with each other at this address. Upon arrival, ACO was given access to the trailer by the property owner. Upon entering, found 1 dog in a single wire crate upside down with no tray and shredded cardboard for flooring. In a Second wire crate found 3 large dogs actively attacking one another. Due to the conditions and no owner present, the

dogs were impounded for their health and safety. This is in violation of Section 3-131 (a) (1) ‘Manner of Keeping; Proper food’; Section 3-131 (a) (2) ‘Manner of Keeping; Proper Water’; Section 3-131 (a) (3) ‘Manner of Keeping; Proper Shelter’; Section 131 (a) (4) ‘Manner of Keeping; Proper Space’; Section 3-131 (a) (5) ‘Manner of Keeping; Proper Exercise’; Section 3-131 (a)(6)‘Manner of Keeping; Proper care’; Section 3-131 (a)(9) ‘Manner of Keeping; Proper Light’; Section 3-142 ‘Irresponsible Pet Owner’; Section 3-180 ‘Cruelty and Neglect’; and 3-186 ‘Vaccination of dogs, cats, and ferrets’.

Allegedly on January 9th, 2026, The Prince Georges County Animal Services Division received a complaint from Anne Arundel Animal Control, advising the vet center is holding a small dog for suspected abuse by the owner. Prince Georges County Animal Services Division responded to the Anne Arundel Veterinary Emergency Clinic and an ACO impounded ‘Skyler’ on January 10th, 2026. This is in violation of Section 3-131 (a)(6)‘Manner of Keeping; Proper care’; Section 3-142 ‘Irresponsible Pet Owner’; Section 3-145 ‘Dog, cat, and ferret license’; Section 3-180 ‘Cruelty and Neglect’; and 3-186 ‘Vaccination of dogs, cats, and ferrets’.

CHARGES:

Allegedly on January 13, 2026, Ms. James was walking her two, large, Labrador-Retriever mixed dogs inside the park, near a the fence line. Five large Terrier mixed dogs were playing at the city dog park when they suddenly escaped through an unsecured gate and attacked her dogs. This is in violation of Section 3-131 “Manner of Keeping; Prohibition of Nuisances”; Section 3-132 ‘Public Nuisance Conditions’; Section 3-135 ‘Animals at large prohibited’; Section 3-136 ‘Dangerous Animals’; Section 3-142 ‘Irresponsible Pet Owner’; Section 3-182 ‘Potentially Dangerous Animals’; and Section 3-186 ‘Vaccination of Dogs, Cats, and ferrets’. Section 3-145 “License of Dogs, Cats, and ferrets’ of the Prince George’s County Code.

CHARGES:

Allegedly Ms. Selby-Snowden's large, black dog has been causing a public nuisance by excessively barking and it is causing discomfort to Ms. Jefferson. This is in violation of Section 3-131 "Manner of Keeping; Prohibition of Nuisances"; Section 3-132 'Public Nuisance Conditions'; Section 3-134 'Excessive noise by an animal prohibited'; and Section 3-142 'Irresponsible Pet Owner' of the Prince George's County Code.

CHARGES:

Allegedly, Ms. Rice has been feeding stray cats which has been causing a cat colony in her neighborhood. The cats are trespassing into private property and damaging property. This is in violation of Section 3-131 "Manner of Keeping; Prohibition of Nuisances"; Section 3-132 'Public Nuisance Conditions'; Section 3-135 'Animals at large prohibited'; Section 3-139 'Defecation; Removal of excrement'; Section 3-140 'Strays and unwanted animals.'; Section 3-142 'Irresponsible Pet Owner'; and Section 3-182 'Potentially Dangerous Animals. of the Prince George's County Code.
