

FREE – Rabbit Handling and Care Class





Free of Charge for Landscape Professionals! ***BYO Lunch!*** Did you know that Prince George's County's Rain Check Program offers rebates to homeowners, businesses and others to install best management practices (BMPs) intended to capture stormwater runoff? This training is designed to provide landscape professionals with practical hands on information on the seven Rain Check Rebate practices and processes. Special emphasis is placed on rain gardens, pavement removal and permeable pavement.

This all-day training teaches landscape professionals how to plan, design, construct and maintain Rain Check Rebate practices. Classroom exercises provide guidance on practice selection, site assessment and site selection. After completion of the classroom training, participants are eligible to sign up for Day 2, which will be a field day to further hone their skills and help install or assess stormwater BMPs. Participants who successfully complete both sessions (classroom training + field day) will be added to the Courty's public list of landscape professionals who have completed the Rain Check Rebate Contractor Training.





HOLIDAYS THAT WILL SLIDE BY ONE DAY



HOLIDAYS THAT WILL BE COLLECTED



Curbside bulky, regular trash and recycling, food scraps, and yard trim (organics) **shall NOT be collected**, and facilities shall be closed, AND collections, including organics, **will slide by one day**:

- MLK Martin Luther King's Birthday
- MD Memorial Day
- JD Juneteenth Day (Observed)
- Independence Day (Observed)

- LD Labor Day
- TD Thanksgiving Day
- CD Christmas Day (Observed)
- NYD New Year's Day (Observed)

Curbside bulky, regular trash and recycling, food scraps, and yard trim (organics) **shall be collected, and facilities shall be open**. The Materials Recycling Facility and Brown Station Road Sanitary Landfill will be open:

- CE County Employee Appreciation Day (Day After Thanksgiving)
- NA Native American Day
- VD Veterans Day (Observed)
- PD President's Day









Bulky trash collections for white goods, appliances, scrap tires, electronics recycling, and scrap metal pickup are made by appointment only through PGC311 and occur on a different pickup schedule than regular curbside bulky trash collection.

Plastic bags are **NOT** accepted in the Recycling or **Compost curbside** collection

Please do not use plastic bags to bag up recyclables or compost.

PGC Composts Expansion Completed!



Collecting food scraps and yard trim at the curb:

- Keeps valuable materials out of our landfill.
- Reduces methane greenhouse gas emissions.
- Protects our environment.
- Helps Prince George's County reach our zero waste goals.





If you receive County trash and recycling collection services, you can now put out **up to four** items of regular bulky trash at the curb with their regular trash collection—**no appointment is needed!** Scrap tires and white goods, including refrigerators, air conditioners, washers, dryers, and other appliances, must still be scheduled for pickup through PGC311.









Effective April 15, due to ongoing construction, the Household Hazardous Waste (HHW) and Electronics Recycling and other associated lots at the Brown Station Road Sanitary Landfill, 11611 White House Road in Upper Marlboro will temporarily close to the public until further notice.

Residents can properly dispose of HHW/E-Waste items at these upcoming mobile event.

GO GREEN THIS HALLOWEEN AND COMPOST YOUR PUMPKIN.

The Prince George's County Department of the Environment (DoE) is pleased to announce pumpkin collection will begin in the fall. In addition to pumpkins, dried corn, hay and straw will also be picked-up for composting along with yard trim.

TO PARTICIPATE

Place items curbside by 6 a.m. on Mondays for pickup. Pumpkins, dried corn, hay and straw MUST be placed in a paper lawn/leaf bag OR the provided 32-gallon green wheeled cart. Pumpkins must be free of inorganic materials such as candles, wax, artificial lighting, loose decorations, etc.

Residents may also drop off pumpkins and other yard trim at the following County Public Convenience Center:

- Pumpkins must be free of inorganic materials such as candles, wax, artificial lighting, loose decorations, etc.





The Better Bag Bill enforcement started April 1, 2024.

Businesses are prohibited from offering plastic bags and instead must offer paper or reusable bags for a fee.

Shoppers can report business violations at PGC311.
