### EXECUTIVE ORDER NO. 46 - 2025

December 9, 2025

#### ESTABLISHING THE PRINCE GEORGE'S COUNTY 2050 GENERAL PLAN ADVISORY COMMISSION

**WHEREAS**, the General Plan for Prince George's County provides broad guidance for future growth, development, and environmental protection, and is a critical tool for ensuring the long-term prosperity and quality of life for all residents; and

**WHEREAS**, the County's current General Plan, "Plan Prince George's 2035," requires periodic review and updates to address evolving demographic, economic, and environmental conditions; and

**WHEREAS**, the development of a comprehensive "Plan Prince George's 2050" necessitates broad public input and expert analysis from a diverse range of stakeholders, including residents, business owners, planning experts, and community leaders; and

**WHEREAS**, the County Executive is vested with the authority under the Prince George's County Charter, pursuant to Section 506 and the laws of the State of Maryland to establish advisory boards and commissions to assist in the coordination of County policies and programs.

**NOW, THEREFORE**, I, Aisha N. Braveboy, County Executive for Prince George's County, Maryland, by virtue of the authority vested in me by the Charter and laws of Prince George's County, do hereby order the following:

#### SECTION 1. ESTABLISHMENT AND PURPOSE

There is hereby established the Prince George's County 2050 General Plan Advisory Commission (hereinafter the "Commission").

#### SECTION 2. PURPOSE AND DUTIES

A. The Commission shall serve in an advisory capacity to the County Planning Board of the Maryland-National Capital Park and Planning Commission (M-NCPPC) and the County Council in the development of recommendations for the "Plan Prince George's 2050" General Plan.

B. The Commission shall solicit and synthesize public input, conduct research, and provide recommendations on key planning elements, including land use, housing, economic vitality, transportation, environmental sustainability, and social equity.

C. The Commission shall work in coordination with the Prince George's County Planning Department and the Planning Board throughout the planning process.

D. The Commission shall submit a final report of its findings and recommendations to the County Executive, the Planning Board, and the County Council by December 1, 2026.

### **SECTION 3. COMPOSITION AND APPOINTMENT**

A. The Commission shall consist of 13 members appointed by the County Executive. Members shall be selected based on their expertise, experience, and commitment to the County's future, and shall include, but not be limited to:

- 1) County Executive or designee as Chair
- 2) County Council Chair or designee as Co-Chair
- 3) M-NCPPC Prince George's County Planning Board Chair or designee
- 4) Prince George's County Chamber of Commerce President & Chief Executive Officer or designee
- 5) Deputy Chief Administrative Officer for Economic Development
- 6) Prince George's County Economic Development Corporation Executive Director
- 7) A representative from the Department of Permitting, Inspections, and Enforcement (DPIE)
- 8) A representative from the real estate industry
- 9) A representative from the local business community
- 10) Three representatives from diverse geographic areas and demographic groups within the County representing civic groups and community organizations.
- 11) An expert in land use law, environmental planning, or urban design

### **SECTION 4. ADMINISTRATION AND SUPPORT**

A. A Consultant selected by the County Executive shall provide necessary administrative and technical support to the Commission, including meeting logistics, data analysis, and report preparation.

B. The Commission shall meet at least quarterly, or more frequently as deemed necessary by the County Executive.


C. All meetings of the Commission shall be subject to the Maryland Open Meetings Act.

### **SECTION 5. TERMINATION**

The Commission shall dissolve one month after the submission of its final report, unless otherwise directed by the County Executive.

### **SECTION 6. EFFECTIVE DATE**
