This case was stayed by order of the Commission on March 25, 2024 (amended March 28, 2024), before the first night of public hearing in order for the parties to proceed before the Circuit Court. This matter remains stayed before the Commission pending its adjudication before the Circuit Court.

Below is an update of petitions for judicial review of Commission decisions before the Circuit Court of Prince George's County.

a. Teonna Marshall v Seafood Fusions, Inc (dba Hook and Reel, Inc.)

This matter was scheduled to be heard March 29, 2024, was continued to May 30, 2024, and subsequently reset to June 28, 2024.

b. Jenchesky Santiago v City of Seat Pleasant

OHR Case No.: OHR21 0701

On February 15, 2024, this case was filed for Judicial Review. This matter was set for hearing May 23, 2024 but was reset to July 12, 2024 following a motion for continuance.
