



### **Overdose Prevention Team Meeting: 7/30/25, 9-10 AM**

- We discussed the proposed activities for the MOOR FY26 grant rewrite—the group was generally aligned and had some added ideas and thoughts
- Unhoused communities- potentially provide ORP start-up support to organizations who serve unhoused populations
- Someone asked if we could work with universities on prevention efforts
- Community ministries- network of churches that works with unhoused populations- community café where they have opportunities for people who are unhoused to convene for social service needs- one of Terry Lawlah's grantees
- Another grantee that serves Langley Park doing mostly tobacco work- very networked in the Hispanic communities- Casa de Maryland
- Coalition of providers in the area
- Denise asked if people in the OPT if they can connect us with community orgs they work with
- DA mentioned that we aren't fully integrated with the larger faith-based community and that we should form more partnerships there.
- Someone in the group disclosed an "incident" in their family where a pre-teen overdosed, but they're more affluent- considering class differences in substance use- their communities may be more able to support these communities because of their resources
- We prioritize higher risk areas from the data from the OD database, OD maps- while we focus on those, we also reach out to the county at large
- Denise mentioned getting connected to the school system and getting that policy through to train youth- youth ambassador program and distribute Naloxone + avoid penalties for carrying Naloxone
