- Provided 2,915 youth with employment opportunities and enriching educational experiences via county-funded and business-funded partnerships.
- Offered Signature Programs that provided opportunities for the young people to experience job readiness training, aviation career exploration, energy conservation as well as start the process for certification in HVAC, automotive, medical office, and information technology help desk.

We wish to thank our partners who invested in our young people and continue to make this program a success. Together, we are Prince George's Proud of our community.

2023 Program Overview & Highlights

The Prince George's County Summer Youth Enrichment Program (SYEP) is an award-winning, nationally recognized program. This six-week program offers Prince George's County's youth and young adults ages 14 through 22 a wide variety of opportunities to explore potential career options by providing them with work experiences with government agencies, local businesses, and community organizations. The SYEP is part of County Executive Angela Alsobrooks' commitment to youth development, which prepares and empowers the County's youth to achieve their full potential into adulthood.

The 2023 SYEP provided eligible youth with the following:

- Targeted opportunities Opportunities and applications were tailored based on age groups: 14 & 15, 16 & 17, and 18 through 22 to allow for programs and job opportunities specific to their age group and preferences.
- **Job Readiness Training (JRT)** Opportunities were made available in each age group that allowed the participants to develop basic work skills to prepare them to be more successful in the workforce.
- Job assignment variety Exposure to a diverse range of careers via our SYEP Signature Programs and partnerships with County agencies, community organizations, and strategic businesses across Prince George's County.
- Rewarding outcomes The ability to earn money and gain meaningful experiences.

2023 Program Overview & Highlights cont.

The 2023 SYEP utilized the following strategies to execute a program that continued to be appealing to the youth and young adults:

- **Simple application** The application was simple enough for the youth applicants to complete independently.
- Recruitment events During the application period, provided two opportunities, to aid
 with the completion of the application for anyone who was experiencing any difficulty.
 These events included a mini-job fair that offered additional opportunities for summer
 employment.
- Interest-based assignments The youth and young adults were able to indicate their job interests on the application. Job assignments were made based on their interests.
- Delivery options Experiences were provided with virtual, in-person, and hybrid delivery options.
- Increased hourly pay rate The pay rates in this year's program were increased to align with Maryland's minimum wage.

Recruitment & Hiring Events

Recruitment events were utilized to provide assistance to youth applying to the summer program. Additional County agencies and business partners were also invited to recruit young adults ages 18-22. These events provided additional opportunities for the youth and young adults to be hired. Below are the highlights of these events:

Signature Programs

The Summer Youth Enrichment Program (SYEP) Signature Programs were developed during the COVID-19 pandemic. At that time, most of the experiences were virtual in order to provide a safe working environment. These programs have now evolved into in-person, virtual, and hybrid experiences that give the participants opportunities to learn valuable skills as they work.

Administrative Support Career Jumpstart Training (hybrid)

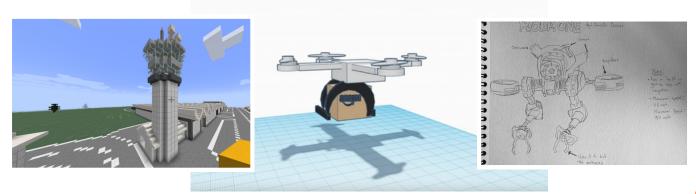
Participants ages 18 through 22 received career training and independent assignments, to include life skills, professional skills, Microsoft Office applications and nationally recognized customer service certification training and testing. Job placement assistance for full-time employment was available for successful completers, including careers in Prince George's County Government. This program was hosted by The Training Source, Inc.

Automotive Technology Industry Training (in-person)

Participants ages 18 through 22 were provided the basic knowledge and skills to start a rewarding career as an entry-level service technician in the high-demand Automotive Service and Repair Industry. Courses focused on the American Service Excellence (ASE) certification content areas for both beginner and advanced students. Students who successfully completed the program earned a Prince George's County Community College Certificate and were eligible for the ASE certification exam. This program was hosted by Prince George's Community College.

Aviation Program: Career Exploration (virtual)

Participants ages 16 and 17 engaged in educational awareness training and explored careers in aviation from professionals working in the Federal Aviation Administration, such as air traffic controllers, pilots, drone operators, and flight instructors. This program was hosted by DC Flight Club.

Bring Your "A" Game to Work (hybrid)

Participants ages 14 through 17 learned the seven foundational values that managers demand: attitude, attendance, appearance, ambition, accountability, acceptance, and appreciation during this job readiness training experience. The seven foundational behaviors connect workplace skills, performance-based skills, and practical skills that businesses require. Activities and materials provided real-time opportunities for practice, observations, and evaluation of industry skills and workplace behaviors and values. Participants who successfully completed the program earned a Center for Work Ethic Certificate and digital badge. The digital badge allows employers to validate skills, credentials, and achievements. This program was hosted by Prince George's Community College.

Energy Conservation (virtual)

Through a series of hands-on explorations, research, and analysis, participants ages 14 and 15 gained a deeper understanding of science, technology, engineering, and mathematics (STEM) related to energy at home, at school and in the community. Participants worked on projects and collaborated using STEM thinking and problem-solving skills. Participants applied their knowledge and work experience to a potential career path in energy, energy efficiency, conservation, engineering, and sustainability. This was hosted by the National Energy Education Development (NEED) Project.

Heating, Ventilation and Air Conditioning (HVAC) Technician Industry Training (in-person)

Participants ages 18 through 22 were prepared for entry into and advancement in the growing industry of HVAC. The course covered Level 1 of the 4-level program. Participants earned a Prince George's Community College Certificate after successfully completing the course. This program was hosted by Prince George's Community College.

Information Technology (IT) Help Desk Technician - Industry Training (in-person)

Participants ages 18 through 22 learned the fundamentals of help desk organization, basic help desk assessments and functions, productivity measurements, problem resolution, and software technologies to track and monitor the help desk infrastructure and more. Participants who successfully completed the program earned a Prince George's Community College Certificate and were eligible to take the CompTia National Certification Exam. This program was hosted by Prince George's Community College.

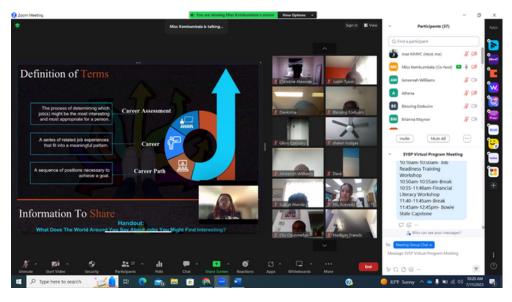

Latin American Youth Center Workplace Readiness (hybrid)

Participants ages 18 through 22 were equipped with job readiness training, life skills workshops, and administrative work with various departments within the organization such as community wellness, housing, and workforce teams. This program was hosted by the Latin American Youth Center (LAYC).

Latin American Youth Center Next Generation Scholars Cohort (hybrid)

Participants ages 16 and 17 were equipped with job readiness training and workplace success skills, science, technology, engineering, and mathematics (STEM) career exploration, financial literacy, and enrichments in the topics regarding social and emotional health, advocacy, nutrition and wellness, and culture. This program was hosted by the Latin American Youth Center (LAYC).

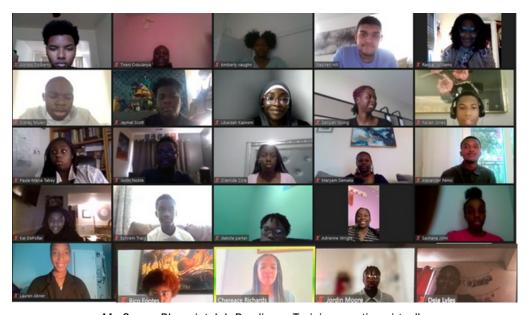
Medical Office Assistant Industry Training (virtual)

Participants ages 18 through 22 learned general administrative tasks including office practices, patient relations, maintaining medical records, and billing. Participants also learned clinical duties such as taking and recording vital signs and medical histories, preparing patients for examinations, drawing blood, and administering medications as directed by the physician. Participants who successfully completed the Medical Office Assistant program earned a Prince George's Community College certificate and were eligible to take the National Healthcareer Association (NHA) Medical Administrative Assistant (CMAA) certification exam. This program was hosted by Prince George's Community College.

My Career Blueprint (virtual)

Participants ages 14 through 17 acquired strategies and insights to catapult their life to the next level professionally and personally. Forward Movement Enterprises designed this learning experience for youth to value continual opportunities to gain knowledge, meet performance goals, and achieve notable success within any organization. This program was hosted by Forward Movement Enterprises.

Summer of Success (virtual)

Participants ages 16 and 17 received a combination of job readiness training, career exploration, and guest speakers from in-demand fields, performed independent and group projects, and participated in real-life work activities that gave participants opportunities to dive deeply into planning for their careers. The 2023 SYEP provided young people with opportunities to explore and explode their future careers possibilities. The kick-off celebration utilized the excitement of the program and the success of some of the SYEP Alumni to get the 2023 participants excited about what was coming with the program.

This year's kick-off celebration was very innovative and exciting. Prince George's County native, comedian, radio/tv talk show host and co-host of Fox 5's DMV Zone, Joe Clair, hosted the celebration. 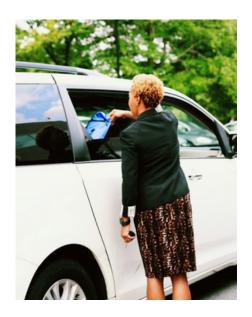

Accokeek Foundation

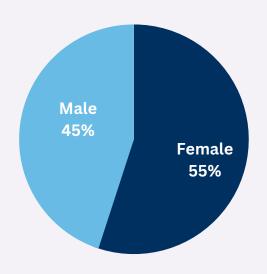

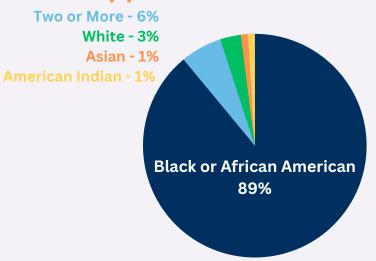

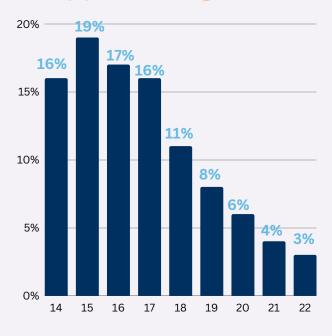
Applicant Gender

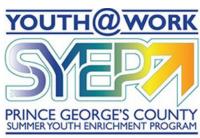
