LEGISLATION UPDATE

Christal Ogene, Policy Analyst, provided an update regarding legislation currently being tracked by the Maryland General Assembly session. The following bills directly impact the police accountability process. The Board reached the following consensus on each Bill.

- HB0031 (SB0202) Police Discipline- Order to Show Cause - **OPPOSE**
- HB0081 (SB055) Motor Vehicles-Police Stops-Secondary Enforcement and Excludable Evidence – **SUPPORT**
- HB0172 (SB0081) Municipalities – Enforcement Officers- Body-Worn Cameras – **OPPOSE**
- HB0349 Public Safety – Law Enforcement – Use of Body Worn Cameras – **SUPPORT**
- HB0508 (SB0330) Public Safety – Police Accountability – Investigation Records Relating to Not Administratively Charged, Unfounded, and Exonerated Complaints – **SUPPORT**
- HB0699 Maryland Use of Force Statue – Failure to Prevent Excessive Force or Render First Aid



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– Misdemeanor – **SUPPORT**

- HB0794 (SB0791) Public Safety – Maryland Police Training and Standards Commission – Prohibition Against Certain Affiliation or Support by Police Officers – **SUPPORT**
- SB0001 (HB0155) Public Safety – Law Enforcement Officers – Prohibition on Face Coverings – **SUPPORT**
- SB0746 Police Discipline – Municipal Law Enforcement Agencies – Suspension Pending Appeal of Trial Board Decision – **OPPOSE**
- HB0686 Vehicle Laws – Eluding Police – Penalties (Zoey's Law) – **NO POSITION**
