Whether you are an entrepreneur or owner of an existing business expanding in Prince George's County wanting to lease a space, you must first ensure that the property is suitable for your business.

**Permitting Guide for Business Owners Looking to Lease Existing Real Estate in Prince George's County** 





Obtaining permits is required by law and protects your business and staff by ensuring the leased space is safe. All business entities seeking to lease space must obtain a new Use and Occupancy (U&O) Permit from DPIE. A new U&O is required for a change of tenant, occupant, use, or owner, even if no construction is taking place. Business owners not in compliance are subject to fines of \$250-\$1000 and will be required to cease operations.

## A Step-by-Step Process

Business owners looking to lease existing space prior to signing a lease should:

- 1. Contact the Prince George's County Economic Development Corporation at 301–583–4650 and DPIE's Business Development Section at DPIEBIZDEV@co.pg.md.us for requirements to operate a business in the County.
- 2. Contact the landlord to discuss your space needs.
- 3. Request the landlord provide you existing plans/drawings for space if available.
  - a. Request landlord provide the previous tenant's Use and Occupancy (U&O) Permit. If the landlord does not have the U&O, request one from MPIA Processing at DPIE | Prince George's County.
- 4. Verify the space meets the zoning code for your business through The Maryland–National Capital Park and Planning Commission (M-NCPPC)!
  - a. THIS IS ONE OF THE MOST CRITICAL STEPS! Without approval from M-NCPPC, DPIE cannot issue a U&O.
  - b. Contact M-NCPPC at PPD-Enviroplanningquestions@ppd.mncppc.org.
- 5. Apply for appropriate business licenses at DPIE.
  - a. Visit DPIE Licensing at Business Licenses | Prince George's or email dpiebusinesslicenses@co.pg.md.us.
- 6. Confirm whether your proposed business would change the space's occupancy use as determined by the building code.
  - a. Review building code requirements at Change of Occupancy Use per the Building Code.
  - b. Review Use & Occupancy | Prince George's County.
  - c. A U&O can be issued within 10 business days if there is no change of use/occupancy or construction.
- 7. Apply for the appropriate permit type via Momentum Prince George's County, DPIE's application software.
