SUBJECT: Sign Permits issued by the Department of Permitting, Inspections

and Enforcement (DPIE)

PURPOSE: The Purpose of this Techno-gram is to eliminate the

requirement for a Sign Permit revision in some instances

when refacing existing signs.

SCOPE: This applies to Sign Permits for existing signs.

Effective immediately, business owners who are proposing to reface an existing sign will not be required to secure a revised Sign Permit if complying with ALL of the following requirements:

- All changes in owner and/or tenant are required to secure a new Use and Occupancy Permit. This policy change pertains only to sign refacing. The new Use and Occupancy Permit shall be issued before the sign is refaced.
- The change to the sign is only to change the name of the tenant or owner.
- The change to the sign is in kind, as compared to the previously issued Sign Permit. For information regarding previously issued Sign Permits, applicants shall submit an <u>MPIA request</u> (<u>Methods for Submitting MPIA</u> Requests | Prince George's County) to DPIE.
- The change to the sign does not include full replacement of the frame and/or structure of the sign and only includes replacement of lettering.
- The overall size of lettering (height and width of all wording) does not exceed the limits allowed by the previously issued Sign Permit.
- Changes to the sign do not involve any electrical work, lighting, illumination, blinking or flashing mechanisms.

- The change to the sign lettering is in compliance with all codes, laws and applicable approvals. County sign codes can be accessed at Prince George's County New 21st Century Zoning Ordinance, Subdivision Regulations, & Landscape Manual (Document Viewer | Zoning Ordinance, Subdivision Regulations, & Landscape Manual (Effective 4/1/2022) and for further guidance from M-NCPPC, contact the Planning Information Counter at PPD-InfoCounter@ppd.mncppc.org.
- This process is not permitted for tobacco, convenience, food and beverage stores.
