PRINCE GEORGE'S COUNTY TO ENFORCE NEW WATERCRAFT PARKING RESTRICTIONS

LARGO, MD — The Revenue Authority of Prince George's County announced that effective Friday, May 23, 2025, watercrafts will be prohibited from parking on public streets, roads, highways, and rights-of-way in Prince George's County in accordance with County Council Bill CB-002-2025. The measure supports a broader County initiative focused on promoting public safety, enhancing neighborhood aesthetics, and addressing concerns about improperly stored and abandoned watercraft within Prince George's County. "The Revenue Authority is proud to partner with the County Council on this initiative to keep Prince George's County beautiful," said Samara Gomez, Deputy Director of the Revenue Authority.

In accordance with the law, individuals in violation shall first be issued a formal warning and a seventy-two (72) hour notice to remove the watercraft. Noncompliance will result in escalating enforcement actions, including a fine of two hundred fifty dollars (\$250) for a first offense, five hundred dollars (\$500) for a second offense, and impoundment for each subsequent violation. Any watercraft deemed abandoned, pursuant to the law, will also be subject to fines and impoundment.

Residents are encouraged to report violations through <u>PGC311</u>, Prince George's County's centralized service request system. Reports may be submitted 24/7 via the PGC311 mobile app or online. Residents may also contact a live agent by calling 3-1-1, Monday through Friday, from 7:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m.
