	<b>PARKING COMPLAINTS</b>			
	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>DPIE handles complaints of vehicles parked on residential lots: on unpaved areas, commercial vehicles in driveways, untagged vehicles, etc.</li> </ul>	✓		
	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>The Revenue Authority handles abandoned vehicles, wrecked and junk vehicles parked on roads, etc.</li> </ul>			✓
	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>The Police Department handles "No Parking" zone violations.</li> </ul>			✓
	<b>STREET MAINTENANCE</b>			
	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>DPW&amp;T is responsible for County-owned roads.</li> </ul>			✓
	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>The State Highway Administration (SHA) is responsible for state "routes" — numbered roads, such as Route 202. Municipalities are responsible for their own streets.</li> </ul>			✓
	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Find out if a roadway is owned by the County, State or a municipality with the <a href="#">Pavement Assessment Management System (PAMS)</a>.</li> </ul>			✓
	<b>TRASH</b>			
	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>DPIE addresses trash on residential or commercial lots and private property.</li> </ul>	✓		
	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>DoE collects County-contracted residential trash, recycle, bulky trash, composting and yard trim.</li> </ul>		✓	
	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>DPW&amp;T addresses complaints about trash on County-owned sidewalks, roads, public rights-of-way, etc.</li> </ul>		✓	
	<b>DRAINAGE ISSUES/FLOODING</b>			
	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Homeowners should address property maintenance. See DoE's <a href="#">Residential Drainage</a> booklet for details.</li> </ul>			✓
	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>DPIE responds to drainage complaints in new subdivisions under permit and those related to structures and unpermitted construction.</li> </ul>	✓		
	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>DPW&amp;T responds to problems that occur on County-owned streets and in the public storm drain system.</li> </ul>		✓	
	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>DoE responds to drainage complaints related to grading, environmental issues, etc.</li> </ul>		✓
