



## 2021 Collaborative Efforts = Success



#### Employment

- Over 4400 participants were employed in both virtual and in-person opportunities

#### Signature Programs

- Diversity of programs offered

#### Youth@Work (Year-Round Program)

- Offered more employment opportunities
- Hired 70 young adults through the Talent Pipeline Program

#### Participant Feedback

- 76% of participants stated that SYEP was their first work experience
- 85% of the participants thought the SYEP experience was beneficial for their future aspirations/goals





# County Agencies 2021 Program Successes



   protect the environment, the adverse effects of
   littering and worked to beautify their community.
- Office of Community Relations & Office of the County Executive - Through the Stand Up & Deliver Program, participants learned about food insecurities and worked on farms, packaged meals and served hundreds of families.



## Nonprofit Organizations 2021 Program Successes

- **Campfire USA** A participant continued to volunteer at their organization after SYEP ended.
- **DC Flight Club Aviation Program** Participants explored various careers in the field of aviation from FAA professionals.
- National Energy Education Development (NEED)

   Participants obtained hands-on STEM experience focused on energy conservation and education.
- Prince George's Community College Offered industry-based training with certifications in the following areas: HVAC, information technology, automotive, and medical billing.
